

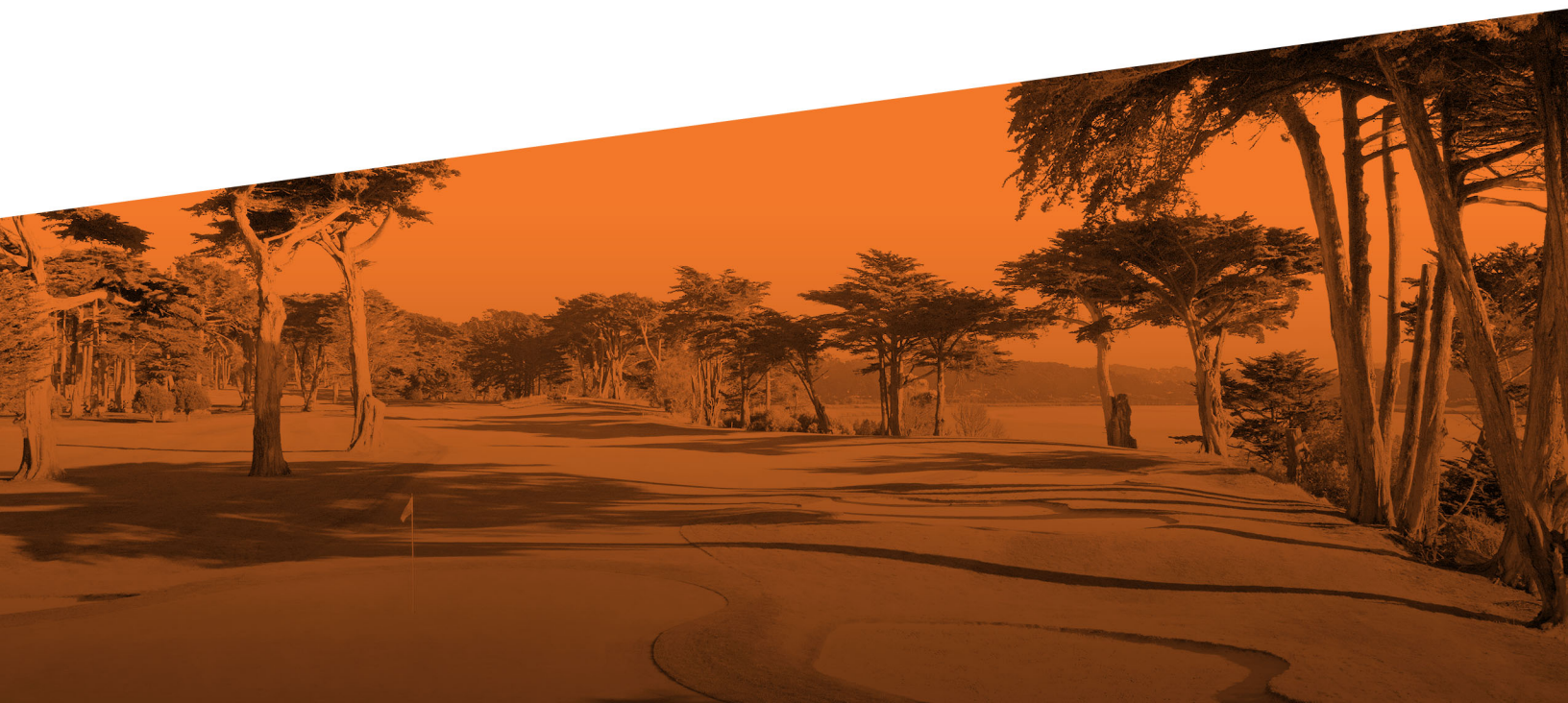

### ABOUT THE HANWHA LIFEPLUS INTERNATIONAL CROWN

The Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown is a team match-play competition that features the best female golfers from the top eight countries across the globe. The competition will return to the LPGA Tour schedule in 2023 after last being held in 2018. It was scheduled to be held in 2020, but went on an indefinite hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The 2023 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown will be held at TPC Harding Park in San Francisco, Calif.

### TEAM/PLAYER SELECTION

The field of eight countries will be determined by the combined Rolex Women's World Golf Rankings of the top four players from each country as of the Rolex Rankings published on Nov. 21, 2022, immediately following the CME Group Tour Championship. The final field of 32 players will be determined via the Rolex Rankings published on April 3, 2023, immediately following the DIO Implant LA Open. If a player ranked in the top four of a pre-qualified country does not compete, the spot will be filled by the country's next highest ranked player available from the Rolex Rankings as of April 3.

### COMPETITION

The competition will take place over four days. It will feature four-ball competition on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. The top two countries from each pool will advance to Sunday. Two semifinal matches will be played Sunday morning. Each semifinal match will consist of two singles matches and one foursomes match. The winning semifinal countries will compete in the final match on Sunday afternoon, and a third-place match will take place between the two losing semifinal countries. Both matches will be the same format as the semifinals.

### SCORING

One point will be awarded for a win, one half-point for a tie and zero points for a loss. All points from the four-ball matches on Thursday-Saturday will be cumulative and will determine the top two countries advancing from each pool. On Sunday, the first country to four points will win the head-to-head matchup.

### THURSDAY-SATURDAY PLAYING FORMAT

Each country will play two four-ball matches against each of the other three countries in their pool. At the conclusion of the three days of four-ball competition, the two countries with the most points from each pool will advance to Sunday.

### SUNDAY PLAYING FORMAT

The semifinals will take place in the morning. The first-place country from Pool A will play the second-place country from Pool B. The first-place country from Pool B will play the second-place country from Pool A. Each matchup will consist of two singles matches and one foursomes match (lineup determined by each respective country). The first country to reach two points will win their match. The winning countries from the semifinals will play each other in the afternoon in the finals. The losing countries from the semifinals will play each other in a third-place match. All matches will be played to a conclusion (no tied matches).



### BREAKING TIES

In the event two countries are tied for first in each pool, the following formula will be used to break ties:

- Total points accumulated in head-to-head matchups between the tied countries
- Total number of matches won in all six four-ball matches
- Highest seeded country entering the competition

If three or more countries are tied for first place, or two or more countries are tied for second place within each group, a playoff will be used to determine the countries advancing to Sunday. If there are only two countries in the playoff, the format for the playoff will be hole-by-hole, four-ball match play. If there are more than two countries in the playoff, the format for the playoff will be hole-by-hole, four-ball stroke play.

### PAST WINNERS

The 2014 International Crown, won by Spain, was held at Caves Valley Golf Club in Owings Mills, Md. The winning team comprised Carlota Ciganda, Azahara Munoz, Belen Mozo and Beatriz Recari.

The 2016 International Crown, won by the United States, was held at Merit Club in Gurnee, Ill. The winning team comprised Cristie Kerr, Stacy Lewis, Gerina Mendoza and Lexi Thompson.

The 2018 International Crown, won by the Republic of Korea, was held at Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea in Incheon, Republic of Korea. The winning team comprised In Gee Chun, In-Kyung Kim, Sung Hyun Park and So Yeon Ryu.

### ABOUT TPC HARDING PARK

Named after U.S. President Warren G. Harding, Harding Park Golf Course opened on July 18, 1925, along the shores of Lake Merced, in San Francisco’s southwest corner. The initial course was designed by Willie Watson and Sam Whiting, who also designed the Lake Course at The Olympic Club.

Harding Park began hosting major amateur tournaments soon after opening, most notably, the USGA National Public Links Championship, and the San Francisco City Championship, the oldest consecutively played competition in the world.

In 1944, the course began hosting PGA Tour tournaments with the Victory Open. Shortly after, the course established itself as one of the top golf courses on the West Coast; where it became a regular stop for PGA Tour events up until the end of the decade, when budgetary cuts caused the course to fall into poor conditions. The course further deteriorated, reaching its lowest point in 1998, when it was used as a parking lot during the U.S. Open at The Olympic Club.

Following a \$16 million restoration in 2002-2003 and a complete re-design, the course reopened on Aug. 22, 2003. TPC Harding Park has since hosted such events as the 2005 WGC-American Express Championship; the 2009 Presidents Cup; the 2010, 2011 and 2013 Charles Schwab Cup Championship; the 2015 WGC Dell Technologies Match Play; and the 2020 PGA Championship.

The 2023 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown marks the first elite women’s competition to be held at TPC Harding Park.
