# BMW Ladies Championship at Seowon Valley Country Club

### **Aon Insight**

Coming down the stretch at Seowon Hills, players must take advantage of the scoring opportunity on the 17th hole, especially when the front tees are utilized. The 17th, playing as a strong dogleg right around water, invites longer hitters to go for the green when teeing off from front tees. When playing from the back tees, most of the field is expected to hit less than driver off the tee. The main decision players face off the tee is what line to take with their drive. Players that opt to lay up will need to navigate the bunker on the left of the landing zone and the water that runs up the right-hand side. If players try to for the green, a combination of distance and accuracy is required.

#### **Aon's Risk Reward Challenge Scoring**

One hole is selected at each tournament as the designated Aon Risk Reward Challenge hole for the week (hole is strategically challenging in nature).

For every participating event, a player's best two scores on the designated hole counts towards the season-long leaderboard.

The player with lowest average score under par across the regular season wins the Aon Risk Reward Challenge and will be awarded at the CME Group Tour Championship.

#### Aon and the PGA TOUR

The 2024 season will showcase the next evolution of Aon's partnership with the PGA TOUR, which will integrate the use of real-time analytics and capitalize on changes to the TOUR's reimagined 2024 schedule.
