Course History: [Sahalee Country Club](#)

Sahalee Country Club was first envisioned in 1965 and began as two separate groups of golf club members who decided that the greater Seattle area was in need of another championship golf course. In 1967, land was established for the course on the Sammamish Plateau east of Redmond, Wash. and was designed by Ted Robinson. The course underwent a redesign and renovations of the bunkers and many key features in 1996, led by Rees Jones. The clubhouse was replaced in 2001 with an expanded dining area and locker room facilities.

Tournament History: The KPMG Women's PGA Championship is the second oldest LPGA major championship, beginning in 1955. Originally being played as the LPGA Championship, in 2015 it was renamed the KPMG Women's PGA Championship after a partnership was announced between the PGA of America, the LPGA and KPMG. This will be the second time this major championship will be played at Sahalee Country Club. It was first played at the venue in 2016 and won by Brooke Henderson.
