#### MORIYA JUTANUGARN CLAIMS THIRD LPGA TOUR VICTORY AT 2024 PORTLAND CLASSIC

With a final-round 66, **Moriya Jutanugarn** won in dramatic fashion at Columbia Edgewater Country Club and claimed her third win on the LPGA Tour at the 2024 Portland Classic.

“Of course it's very happy, and also, you know, like I think it's been a while I haven't been in contention and also like to handle this situation. Of course it's like nervous and exciting out there,” said Jutanugarn on her win. “To be honest, like the last two season wasn't feel really good, you know, like to myself and stuff. But keep working on something and I guess just the hard work, it pay off.”

Entering Sunday, Jutanugarn sat in solo sixth place and three shots back of leader and 2022 Portland Classic champion **Andrea Lee**. A 12-year LPGA Tour veteran, Jutanugarn is no stranger to sitting close behind the lead, having been within five shots of the lead entering the final round over 30 times in her career on Tour.

Jutanugarn teed off on Sunday in the third-to-last group alongside first-round leader **Polly Mack**. The Thai player came out of the gates steady, making pars on the first and second holes before picking up a birdie on the par-4 3rd hole to move to -17. Snagging three more pars on holes 4, 5 and 6, she recorded back-to-back birdies on Nos. 7 and 8 to jump to -19. Jutanugarn remained fairly quiet through the turn but went on a tear to climb her way up the leaderboard with birdies on holes 12 through 14. With a birdie on No. 13, she tied **Dewi Weber**'s lead at -21 and then took the solo lead with a one-putt birdie on the 14th. A chip-in on the par-4 17th accounted for her 23rd birdie of the tournament and her last birdie of the final round to put her at -23, a lead of three strokes at the time.

Up until the 18th hole, Jutanugarn had picture perfect scorecards each day of the Portland Classic. But, on the final-hole, she missed the fairway and hit her approach shot over the green. Her putt from the fringe stopped too short and she still had about eight feet left to the hole. She missed the par putt and tapped in to record her first and only bogey in 72 holes of the Portland Classic. She fell just short of joining both Jin Young Ko (2019 CPKC Women's Open) and Inbee Park (2015 HSBC Women's World Championship) as the only bogey-free winners in 72-hole events on the LPGA Tour in the last 30 years.

With a two-stroke lead and two groups behind her still to finish, Jutanugarn surrounded herself with family and friends as she came closer and closer to securing her first victory on the LPGA Tour since she won the 2021 Dow Championship alongside her sister **Ariya Jutanugarn**, and third victory of her tour career along with her win at the 2018 Fir Hills Seri Pak Championship.

“I would say so excited and so proud of her, because like I know she been waiting for so long,” said sister Ariya on how happy she was for Moriya's victory. “Even like we won together at 2021, but she always say like, Oh, I want to win like by myself. You know, it's good time we won together, but like she go through up and down in her life. She been like really struggle and this year is really hard for her. She be like really struggle and this year, this tournament is show like she well deserve because she never give up. No matter what happened, she always work hard. Like even I'm play some tournament I finish better, I'm lazy and not practice, but she is never do that. She work so hard and I feel like she well deserve it.”

Finishing in a tie for second-place, **Narin An**, **Nataliya Guseva** and **Angel Yin** each made runs up the leaderboard with rounds of 66, 68 and 69, respectively. Four groups ahead of M. Jutanugarn, An made four consecutive birdies on her front nine to boost herself into the conversation at the Portland Classic. She added a birdie on No. 10 and then, with a six-iron from 170 yards, made a hole-in-one on No.16 to reach -21 under and grab a share of the lead at the time. She bogeyed her final hole to drop to -20 and two shots behind Jutanugarn.

An LPGA Tour rookie, Guseva carded five birdies through her first 17 holes to reach -21, one shot behind Jutanugarn at the time, but also bogeyed her last hole to drop a shot coming in. With a T2 finish, Guseva earned her second consecutive top-10 finish and her best finish so far on the LPGA Tour.

Yin started the day two shots behind leader, Lee, and made three birdies on her front nine to reach -20. The 2023 Buick LPGA Shanghai winner made a birdie on No. 10, a bogey on No. 11 and finished her final round with seven consecutive pars to earn her best finish of the year in her 11th start on Tour. The American has played poratically throughout the year due to a lingering ankle injury that she sustained in January.

First-round leader Mack finished T5 and claimed her best finish on the LPGA Tour in a non-team event; she has a T3 finish at the 2023 Dow Championship alongside partner **Celine Borge**. Second-round leader and Dutchwoman **Dewi Weber** recorded a final-round 72 with a double bogey on her 15th and a bogey on the 16th to drop to solo eighth. This is also Weber's best finish on the LPGA Tour in a non-team event; she has a T6 finish at the 2022 Dow Championship alongside partner **Pauline Roussin-Bouchard**. Third-round leader Lee shot a final-round 74 to drop into a tie for ninth-place, but claimed her fifth top-10 finish of the season.

#### ABOUT THE WINNER

Rolex Rankings No. 132 Moriya Jutanugarn

- Jutanugarn shot a 6-under 66 on Sunday with seven birdies and a bogey
  - She went bogey-free through 71 holes at the Portland Classic, making her only bogey of the week on the 18th hole on Sunday
  - She tied her career-low 72-hole score of 266 in her win at the Portland Classic, previously shot at the 2017 Meijer LPGA Classic for Simply Give
  - This is the seventh time in her career she has recorded four rounds in the 60s and first since the 2021 Meijer LPGA Classic for Simply Give

- Jutanguarn earns her third LPGA Tour victory and first since the 2021 Dow Championship, which she won alongside her sister **Ariya Jutanugarn**
  - She also won the 2018 Fir Hills Seri Pak Championship
- She is the fourth Thai player to win on the LPGA Tour this season, joining **Patty Tavatankit** (Honda LPGA Thailand), **Attaya Thitikul** (Dow Championship) and **Chanettee Wannasaen** (Dana Open)
- She is the second Thai player to win the Portland Classic, and second in a row following **Chanettee Wannasaen** in 2023
- She is the third player from Thailand to earn at least three wins on the LPGA Tour, joining Thitikul (3) and her sister Ariya (12)
- She is the 16th different player to win on Tour this season
- She wins the Portland Classic in her eighth start at the event
  - Her previous best finishes in the event were T3 results, which she earned in 2020 and 2017
- This is her 18th start of the 2024 season
  - She has made 13 cuts in her 18 starts with one win and one additional top-5 finish
    - She finished T5 at the T-Mobile Match Play presented by MGM Rewards earlier this year
- This is her 12th season on the LPGA Tour
  - She was named the Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the Year in 2013
  - She qualified for the LPGA Tour on her first attempt by earning co-medalist honors at the 2012 LPGA Final Qualifying

#### THINGS TO KNOW

- The 2024 Portland Classic has a different leader at the end of each day of player
  - **Polly Mack** was the first-round leader and finished T5
  - **Dewi Weber** was the second-round leader and finished eighth
  - **Andrea Lee** was the third-round leader and finished T9
- There were seven players that recorded four rounds in the 60s at the 2024 Portland Classic including **Moriya Jutanugarn, Narin An, Angel Yin, So Mi Lee, Ariya Jutanugarn, Ruixin Liu** and **Amanda Doherty**
- Three players finished T2 at the Portland Classic
  - **Narin An** shot a 6-under 66 on Sunday to move from T12 to T2
    - She made a hole-in-one on the 16th hole on Sunday, hitting her 6-iron 170 yards
      - It was the third hole-in-one of the week at the Portland Classic, following **Jiwon Jeon** and **Celine Herbin** who both made ace on No. 2 with 8-irons
      - It is the 19th hole-in-one of the 2024 season, bringing the season donation total of the [CME Group Cares Challenge – Score 1 for St. Jude](#) to \$380,000
    - This is An's best finish of her LPGA Tour career and of the 2024 season
      - Her previous best of the season was a T3 result at the T-Mobile Match Play presented by MGM Rewards
      - She has finished T3 two other times, at the 2022 Portland Classic and the 2022 JTBC Classic Presented by Barbasol
  - **Nataliya Guseva** also earned her career best finish with the T2 result
    - This is her rookie season on the LPGA Tour
      - She finished T23 at the 2023 LPGA Q-Series to earn LPGA Tour Membership
    - Her previous best finishes were T6 results at the JM Eagle LA Championship presented by Plastpro and last week's CPKC Women's Open
    - This is her fourth top-10 finish of her rookie year and second consecutive top-10 finish after a T6 at last week's CPKC Women's Open
  - **Angel Yin** earned her best finish if the 2024 season, so far
    - This is her second top-5 finish of the year, following a T5 result at the T-Mobile Match Play presented by MGM Rewards

- This is the second time in her LPGA Tour career that she has recorded four rounds in the 60s and the first since the 2018 Indy Women in Tech Championship
- This was Yin's 11th start of the 2024 season
  - She skipped or withdrew from several events this season due to a lingering ankle injury, which she sustained in January
- Three players finished T5, including **Sofia Garcia**, **So Mi Lee** and Mack
  - It is Garcia's best finish on the LPGA Tour
  - It is Lee's first top-10 finish on the LPGA Tour as a 2024 rookie
    - She has made 16 starts this season and made six cuts
  - It is Mack's best finish in a non-team event on the LPGA Tour
    - She finished T3 at the Dow Championship alongside partner **Celine Borge**
    - She has made four of 14 starts on the LPGA Tour this season
    - Mack was a 2023 LPGA Tour rookie
- **Dewi Weber** finished solo eighth in just her second start of the LPGA Tour season
  - This is her best finish on the LPGA Tour in a non-team event
    - She finished T6 at the Dow Championship alongside partner **Pauline Roussin Bouchard**
  - She has played primarily on the Epson Tour this season, with four top-10 finishes including a runner-up finish at the Casino del Sol Golf Classic
  - Her only other start on Tour this year was at the ShopRite LPGA Classic Presented by Acer, where she finished T52
- Five players finished T9 including third-round leader and 2022 Portland Classic Champion Lee, last week's CPKC Women's Open champion **Lauren Coughlin**, winner Moriya's sister **Ariya Jutanugarn**, and 2023 rookie **Grace Kim** and 2020 rookie **Jiwon Jeon**

#### SOLHEIM CUP UPDATE:

This week's Portland Classic presented a big opportunity for Americans hoping to qualify for the Solheim Cup team

- The Portland Classic is the third-to-last event for players to qualify for the U.S. Team
- Heading into the week in Portland, there were only 22 American players who could still qualify for the team via Solheim Cup points
  - Of those 22, only 16 competed in the Portland Classic
  - This week was the first week that players were eliminated from qualifying for the team based on the number of points they have

- **Nelly Korda**, **Lilia Vu** and **Ally Ewing** have already clinched three spots on the team via Solheim Cup points
- **Allisen Corpuz** (4<sup>th</sup> in Solheim Cup Standings) and **Lauren Coughlin** (5<sup>th</sup> in Solheim Cup Standings) were the only players who could have clinched a spot this week in Portland
  - Either would have clinched with a win
  - Clinching scenarios based on Corpuz's and Coughlin's finishes will be run on Monday
  - Corpuz finished T30 with rounds of 70-68-70-68
  - Coughlin finished T9 and grabbed her sixth top-10 finish of the season
- **Andrea Lee**, the 2022 Portland Classic champion, is currently 7th in the Solheim Cup standings, which is the last position to qualify via Solheim Cup Points
  - Lee sat in first place heading into the final round
  - She shot a 74 on Sunday and dropped to T9
  - She earned her fifth top-10 finish of the 2024 season
- Other notable players in the Solheim Cup standings and their finishes at the Portland Classic:
  - **Angel Yin** (12th) – T2, -20
  - **Alexa Pano** (17<sup>th</sup> in Solheim Cup Standings) – T14, -16
  - **Yealimi Noh** (20th) – T30, -12
  - **Jennifer Kupcho** (10<sup>th</sup>) – T30, -12
  - **Cheyenne Knight** (14th) – T39, -11
  - **Lucy Li** (19th) – T60, -7
  - **Danielle Kang** (21st) – T67, -4
- **Ryann O'Toole** (16th), **Lindsey Weaver-Wright** (23rd), **Stacy Lewis** (24th) and **Caroline Inglis** (25th) each missed the cut
- The Solheim Cup qualification period ends immediately following the AIG Women's Open

"Of course every win is special, and like kind of been a long time since my last win. You know, like to be in contention for the last few days, it's kind of nice. And, you know, like I feel like I haven't been in contention for a little while. It's like kind of keep you on the toe and exciting."

*Nataliya Guseva on having her best finish on the LPGA Tour*

"I'm honestly pretty happy. You know, I put a lot of work into that, but at the same time, I'm kind of disappointed because I knew like I could win this thing very easily. You know, there is still a lot of work that I should do, and I'm that type of person who's always just grinding out there, putting the work in. Yeah, I'm happy that I'm here on the LPGA and just happy to play every day with the best players in the world. It's such a pleasure being out here and watching the best players out here."

"I would like to see it but I couldn't see it. So like greens are bright and then ball was white, so like couldn't see it. But I heard the sound from the green, like around the green, the spectators. First time like, Whooo, and then like Rahhhh, like this. It was awesome."

"I think I learn more out here. I played with Lauren Coughlin. I was very impressed by her. Like she's just like fairway, fairway, fairway. Of course out here she shot a bogey-free 6-under yesterday. It was just fairway, fairway, fairway. So I think that's something they're very good at here. They don't have necessarily hit it crazy far. Just that's a little different. I feel like it's a golf course where you have to be a little bit more precise off the tee otherwise you get blocked out or you're in the trees. I think everyone who is here deserves to be here. So feel like no matter who you play with you're going to learn something."
