### **Additional Notes**

- Renovation includes practice facility (2004), short game area (2011), bunker renovation and fairway contouring (2014), numerous holes, greens, tees redesigned (2022), including all of hole #1, #2 tees, #3 approach, green and bunker, #4 tees, #16 tees and surrounds and #18 tees.
- Average fairway widths in landing areas: 23-28 yards.
- · Area has seen record heat and drought.
- Course is an Audubon Certified Sanctuary.
- Course hosted the 1<sup>st</sup> 4 Presidents Cups in the USA (1994, 96, 2000, 2005) and Quicken Loans Tiger Woods Inv. (2015).
- Final 10 holes play along Lake Manassas, but only #11 (par 3) crosses the water.
