KPMG Insight of the Week

*Over the last two years at Carlton Woods, players who have finished in the top-ten at the Chevron Championship have gained 21.4 percent of their strokes gained total from shots off the tee. The LPGA Tour average for top-ten finishers in that span is just 15 percent – a significant increase. A look at the other percentages compared to their LPGA Tour mean:

*Among players with at least a dozen rounds in the majors last year, Lilia Vu had the best scoring average, at 70.50. Ally Ewing and Ayaka Furue (71.00) had the best among players to compete in all 20 major championship rounds played.

*Nelly Korda leads all players in birdies or better and strokes gained total in the two years since this championship has moved to Carlton Woods. She's also second in greens in regulation and in the top-ten among qualified players in strokes gained putting per round.

*In two starts at Carlton Woods, Lydia Ko has missed the cut and finished in a tie for 17th place. She has lost more than two strokes on the greens here in six rounds, an uncharacteristic number to see from the 2016 winner of this event.

Lauren Coughlin

*It's almost impossible to overstate the incredible improvement in Lauren Coughlin's putting over the last two seasons. From 2022-23, Coughlin gained 1 stroke or more on the greens in 14.8% of her rounds. Since the beginning of 2024, that number is 40.4%.
