Today – Patchy light fog is possible through 8AM across the course. As the sun begins to shine through the late morning, isolated showers will become possible in the area with timing favoring beyond 2PM. A pop-up strong t-storm or two is not out of the question this afternoon, but coverage across the area will remain isolated. S/SE winds will near 6-12mph alongside PM highs in the low-to-mid 80s.

Extended forecast – An active but messy pattern will remain across southeast Texas through the work week. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms are possible each day with coverage most expansive Wednesday. Thursday and Friday will feature more isolated activity through the PM hours as surface heating commences. Rainfall totals will vary greatly depending on where storms initiate. General S/SE flow the next several days will continue to provide the region with warm and unstable air allowing for the continual threat through Friday. Drier conditions forecast through the weekend.
