**Today** – A large cluster of rain and storms is on approach from the west this morning. It will enter the region by 7-8AM and begin to weaken/exit around 12-1PM. On the heels of the early morning complex, isolated showers and storms do hold potential to redevelop this afternoon in the area but coverage will remain isolated in nature. Heavy rainfall and frequent lightning are the main threats this AM.

**Extended forecast** – A messy and potentially active pattern will remain in place through Friday across the region. Isolated showers and embedded storms will remain possible Thursday and Friday afternoons as warm and unstable conditions persist in the area. Coverage will remain spotty but any cells that traverse the course will hold the potential for sporadic lightning and brief heavy rainfall both afternoons. By Saturday, a drier and more stable airmass will take hold leading to generally partly cloudy skies through the weekend. S/SE winds will remain all week, with some gusts over the weekend near 20mph at times.
