"I would see that as like a challenging things. Like one challenge to do. I'm not saying it's like stressful much because I know I'm still young and a lot of opportunity will come forward. I'm thinking all the things that I have been doing out here on the Tour, I have done enough, and then I give it all 100% and I just let it be more natural. If I get it, I'll get it. If not, it's just more things to do, more than life, more than golf."

Vu on how her 2024 injury has led to more awareness and perspective in her life

"I think it teaches you a lot of lessons that I feel like sometimes you need balance in your life a little bit. Like I think I got caught up with golf being my identity, and during that two months I saw a lot of family, a lot friends. I couldn't hit for a couple weeks so I was just doing other things. Read a lot. Listened to audio books. Just tried my best to become a better person. That's all I could improve at that point. Physically I was trying my best with PT and learning how to breathe correctly and fixing my posture, the way I sit. Just a whole kind of life change I would say. I think everything happens for a reason, and I think that needed to happen so that I could have more body awareness. I think I was just kind of playing golf mindlessly. That does help sometimes when you're playing well, not thinking about too much, but it kind of shows that I never really reflected how when I was playing well just mindlessly, how to get there again. Now I definitely have more body awareness and more swing awareness."

"Well, I think it's his calmness. He's a really calm guy I think. He has the ability to shoot like super tough shots. Like the one I think it's on Sunday night, the third quarter. I'm hoping I can do all things on the course, too."

I was and happy for Shane because it was his first LPGA Tour win. We put in so much time and hard work in, so it was so much fun. Nice to have my mom there. I feel a little bit more -- like I know what the close future is going to hold, which is lovely."
