COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- 1st: Jeeno Thitikul shot a 6-under 64
 - Carded nine birdies including three consecutive from Nos. 4-6 and four consecutive from Nos.
 11-14
 - Hit 11/14 fairways, 15/18 greens in regulation with 25 putts
 - o Recorded the most birdies across the field (24) through three rounds
 - o T1 for the most greens in regulation hit (48/54) through three rounds
 - Set the 54-hole tournament scoring record (194)
 - Recorded her lowest career 54-hole score
 - Her best was a 196 at the 2022 Walmart NW Arkansas Championship presented by P&G

- With her nine birdies today, clinched the LPGA single season record for birdie-or-better average
- Thitikul is in the running for two LPGA Tour awards that will be finalized after this week Rolex Player of the Year and Vare Trophy (scoring average)
 - Rolex Player of the Year honors is between her and Miyu Yamashita
 - Yamashita has to win the CME Group Tour Championship to win the award
 - Vare Trophy is down to Thitikul, Nelly Korda, Minjee Lee and Yamashita
 - Going into the week, Thitikul had a 68.877 scoring average
 - She is on pace to pass Annika Sorenstam for the lowest scoring average in an LPGA Tour season; must finish at -25 to pass Sorenstam
- o Jeeno Thitikul Third-Round Highlights
- T2: Nelly Korda and Pajaree Annanarukarn are tied for second at 200 following R3
 - o Korda recorded a bogey-free 65
 - Birdied Nos. 4, 6, 9, 13, 14, 15, 17
 - Hit 13/14 fairways, 16/18 greens in regulation and had 27 putts
 - Ninth appearance at this event
 - Previous best finish was 2nd in 2018
 - Nelly Korda Third-Round Interview
 - Nelly Korda Third-Round Highlights
 - Anannarukarn carded a 7-under 65
 - Recorded six birdies, an eagle and a bogey
 - Hit 12/14 fairways, 15/18 greens in regulation and had 26 putts
 - Ranked No. 60 in the Race to CME Globe, making her the last player to get into the CME Group Tour Championship field
 - This is her second 65 of the 2025 LPGA Tour season and first since the JM Eagle LA Championship
 - Best 18-hole score at the CME Group Tour Championship
 - Fifth appearance at this event, previous best finish was 6th in 2022
- 4th: Sei Young Kim had a third consecutive round in the 60s
 - Had six birdies and two bogeys to finish with a 4-under 68
 - Hit 13/14 fairways and 17/18 greens in regulation with 31 putts
 - o Her 11th appearance at the CME Group Tour Championship
 - Won the event in 2019
- 5th: Somi Lee finished round three with a 4-under 68
 - Carded seven birdies and three bogeys
 - Hit every fairway, 16/18 greens in regulation and had 30 putts
 - o This is her first appearance in the CME Group Tour Championship
- Gaby Lopez matched the tournament scoring record with a 10-under 62
 - o Recorded a bogey-free round with 10 birdies
 - Birdied Nos. 1, 2, 4, 6, 7, 8, 9, 13, 17, 18
 - Hit 12/14 fairways, 12/18 greens in regulation and had only 22 putts
 - This is her career best round on the LPGA Tour
 - o Rose from T37 after the second round to solo 8th following the third
 - o Gaby Lopez Third-Round Interview

WITH A WIN

Jeeno Thitikul

- Would earn her seventh LPGA Tour career victory and third of the 2025 season
- Would be the winningest player on the LPGA Tour in 2025 with three wins
 - Miyu Yamashita had two wins, while 27 players had one win
- Would be her winningest season on the LPGA Tour, winning more than two events for the first time in her career
- With the \$4 million winner's check, would be the fastest player to reach \$17 million
 - o Thitikul was also the fastest to reach \$8 million, \$9 million, \$10 million, \$11 million, \$12 million and \$13 million
- Would be \$5,214,293 behind No. 1 Annika Sorenstam on the Official Career Money List
- Would be projected to move within the top 10 in the Official Career Money List
- Would have earned the most official money by a Thai player, surpassing Ariya Jutanugarn
- Would be the second player to win back-to-back CME Group Tour Championship, joining Jin Young Ko (2020, 2021)
- Would be the third player to win the CME Group Tour Championship multiple times (Lydia Ko, 2014 and 2022; Jin Young Ko, 2020 and 2021)
- Would be the second Thai player to win the CME Group Tour Championship, joining Ariya Jutanugarn (2017)

Nelly Korda

- Would earn her 16th LPGA Tour career victory and first since 2024's The ANNIKA driven by Gainbridge
- Would be the 30th different winner of the 2025 LPGA Tour season
- Would be the third American player to win the CME Group Tour Championship, joining Cristie Kerr (2015) and Lexi Thompson (2018)
- With the \$4 million winner's check, would be \$3,024,135 away from reaching No. 1 Annika Sorenstam on the Official Career Money List

Pajaree Anannarukarn

- Would earn her third LPGA Tour victory and first since the 2023 T-Mobile Match Play presented by MGM Rewards
- Would be the third Thai player to win the CME Group Tour Championship, joining Jeeno Thitikul (2024) and Ariya Jutanugarn (2017)
- Would be the second consecutive Thai winner of the CME Group Tour Championship, following Jeeno Thitikul in 2024
- With the \$4 million winner's check, would surpass \$7 million in career earnings
- Would earn her best finish of the 2025 season, with her previous best finish being T10 at the seasonopening Hilton Grand Vacations Tournament of Champions
- Would be the lowest Rolex Women's World Golf Rankings player to win the CME Group Tour Championship at No. 91
 - Previous lowest-ranked winner was Amy Yang in 2023 at No. 36

 Would be the first player ranked No. 60 in the Race to CME Globe to win the CME Group Tour Championship

 - o Competed in the event every year she has been on Tour
 - o Has not finished outside the top 10 in her previous starts at this event
- 2025: Two wins, 13 top-10 finishes
 - o Finished in the top 10 in last five starts
 - Four runner-up finishes including back-to-back at the FM Championship and Kroger Queen City Championship
 - o 18 cuts made in 19 previous starts
- Career: Six wins, 54 top-10s, \$13.3 million Career Official earnings
 - Three-time LPGA Tour Award recipient
 - Two-time Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown participant representing Thailand
 - o 2024 Olympian representing Thailand
- Finished 3rd at 2021 LPGA Q-Series to earn LPGA Tour Membership
