COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- 1st: **Grace Kim** captured her first major title in a two-hole playoff with **Jeeno Thitikul**
 - Kim shot a 4-under 67 on Sunday
 - Had two eagles, four birdies, two bogeys and one double-bogey in regulation
 - Eagled No. 18 to force a playoff
 - On the first playoff hole, hit the water on her approach, took a one-stroke penalty and holed her fourth shot for a birdie
 - On the second playoff, hit her approach to 10 feet and made eagle to earn the victory
 - Hit 10/13 fairways and 13/18 greens in regulation with 28 putts
 - The only player to have two eagles in one regulation round this week
- 2nd: **Jeeno Thitikul** earned her ninth career top-10 finish at a major championship

- Thitikul shot a bogey-free 67 on Sunday
 - The only player with four rounds in the 60s
 - Had four birdies in regulation
 - Missed a birdie putt on the final hole that would have clinched the victory
 - On the first playoff hole, hit her approach above the hole and got up and down for birdie to force a second playoff hole
 - On the second playoff, again hit her approach above the hole and chipped to 6 feet for a birdie attempt, but Kim made eagle to win
 - Hit 11/13 fairways and 16/18 greens in regulation with 30 putts
 - Second in the field with 61 total greens in regulation
- T3: **Lottie Woad** carded a 4-under 67 and finished T3 at -13 overall
 - Her 13-under 271 is the lowest 72-hole score by an amateur in Evian history
 - Her final-round 64 is the lowest round ever by an amateur at Evian
 - Now has a total of 20 points in the LPGA Elite Amateur Pathway and has met the threshold to become eligible for LPGA Membership
 - Will need to turn professional to join the LPGA; if Woad does so immediately, she will have status for the remainder of the 2025 season and all of 2026
 - Can also choose to accept membership for only the 2026 season, but Woad will only have status for that calendar year
- T3: **Minjee Lee** shot a 3-under 68 to jump into a tie for third
 - Eagled the final hole
 - After winning last month's KPMG Women's PGA Championship, was aiming to become the first person since **Inbee Park** in 2013 to win consecutive majors

ABOUT THE CHAMPION

[Rolex Rankings No. 99 Grace Kim](#)

- Earns her second LPGA Tour victory and first since the 2023 LOTTE Championship presented by Hoakalei
- Claims her first major championship victory since joining the Tour in 2023
- Third consecutive player to earn her first major at The Amundi Evian Championship, joining **Ayaka Furue (2024)** and **Celine Boutier (2023)**
 - Seventh player to earn her first major championship victory at The Amundi Evian Championship

- Third player this season to earn their first major championship
 - **Mao Saigo** won The Chevron Championship and **Maja Stark** won the U.S. Women's Open presented by Ally
- Becomes the second Australian to win The Amundi Evian Championship and first since **Minjee Lee** won in 2021
- Is the third player to win The Amundi Evian Championship in a playoff since its major elevation in 2013, joining **Minjee Lee** (2021) and **Anna Nordqvist** (2017)
- Becomes the fifth Australian to win a major championship and first since **Minjee Lee** at last month's KPMG Women's PGA Championship
- Joining **Minjee Lee**, it is the first time two Australians have won major championships in a single season on both the men's and women's Tours
 - **Karrie Webb** won two majors in a single season twice in her career (2000, 2001)
- Is the 10th player from Australia to win at least two times on the LPGA Tour
- Becomes the 19th different winner on the LPGA Tour in 2025 through 18 events
 - **Jin Hee Im** and **Somi Lee** won the Dow Championship
- Becomes the second player from Australia to win on Tour this season, following **Minjee Lee** at last month's KPMG Women's PGA Championship
- Third start at The Amundi Evian Championship as a Tour Member
 - T51 in 2024, MC in 2023
 - Finished T15 as a non-member in 2022
- 12th start of the 2025 season; nine cuts made, one major championship
 - Best non-win finish is ninth at the Black Desert Championship presented by Greater Zion
- Career: Two wins, seven career top-10 finishes, \$3,170,151 million in career official earnings
 - First win was at the 2023 LOTTE Championship presented by Hoakelai
 - 10th Aussie to win twice on the LPGA Tour
 - One career victory on the Epson Tour: 2022 IOA Golf Classic
 - Finished fifth on the Race for the Card to first earn LPGA Tour Membership for 2023

QUOTABLE

Grace Kim (1st, -14) on making the final putt that made her a major champion

"I thought about it before I made the putt. Probably, yeah, probably shouldn't have, but that's okay. Got me more nervous. I remember Ayaka putting in a similar line. Yeah, I think I've had a lot of double breakers this week and that was one of them for sure. Yeah, just looked straight at the hole. That's what my caddie told me to do and I did it. Yeah, I don't know what happened. Like I don't know how I'm in here already since then. Yeah, just all happened quickly, but I'm glad I'm sitting here for sure."

Jeeno Thitikul (2nd, -14) on how proud she is of her play today

"I think I'm so proud of myself on battling out there today. I know like it's going to be a tough day, it's going to be a long day, but I just want to say I'm so proud of myself and what I did out there."

Lottie Woad (T3, -13) on being the first player to reach the LEAP points threshold to earn her LPGA card

"It's really cool. It's always nice to be the first to do something, so just grateful that I had the opportunity to do it. Just, yeah, relieved now. It was kind of wearing on me for a bit."

Minjee Lee (T3, -13) on her week at The Amundi Evian Championship

"It's always really special to be here. Just have really great memories here. I had a couple of my family come from Korea so it was nice to have them here. The weather was good, so I think overall I could take a lot of positives with me to the next two events I'm playing in Europe. Yeah, I'm a little disappointed, but I'm still happy with my result."

Andrea Lee (T5, -12) on the positives she'll take away from this week

"I've been playing really solid golf as of late. Just trying to keep that momentum and trying to instill a lot of confidence and belief in myself. Just putting myself in the position over and over again and hopefully it'll pay off one day. Yeah, everything feels really good. Just going to try and sharpen a little bit stuff here and there and get ready for those last two weeks this Europe."

Angel Yin (T5, -12) on her great finish this week

"Feels amazing. This is the one major that always gives me a lot of headaches. Has been giving my headaches this week. On the greens especially. I mean, look at my stats. I think first day I had three three-putts. Every single day except for today I had a three-putt. It's really frustrating when I'm good on the greens to not be able to perform on the greens and perform elsewhere. And so you feel like you're really handicapping yourself somewhere that you're good at. So I think that really eats away, so I have to regroup every day and try to see what I can do better for the next day. But this course does that, so I'm happy with how I finished. I think this is the best I've ever done."
