- 1st: [Somi Lee](#) shot a 6-under 65 to hold the lead at -10 overall
 - Recorded one eagle, six birdies and two bogeys on Friday
 - One of five players to make an eagle on No. 9 today
 - Hit 11/13 fairways and 15/18 greens in regulation with 28 putts
 - Second time leading or co-leading after the second round
 - Joining the 2025 Mizuho Americas Open
 - Her 36-hole 132 is tied for her lowest-ever 36 holes
 - Joining the 2025 Black Desert Championship presented by Greater Zion
 - Her second-round 65 is tied for her lowest-ever round
 - Joining the second round of the 2024 LPGA Drive On Championship and the fourth round of the 2025 Meijer KPGA Classic for Simply Give
 - 2nd: [Grace Kim](#) carded a 3-under 68 for a two-day total of 9-under 133
 - Recorded four birdies and one bogey
 - Hit 12/13 fairways and 15/18 greens in regulation with 30 putts
 - Her 36-hole 133 is tied for her third-lowest 36 holes and is her lowest-ever 36-hole score at a major
 - Her previous major-low was a 140 at the 2024 Amundi Evian Championship
 - 3rd: [Jennifer Kupcho](#) carded a second-round 69, finishing at -8 overall
 - Recorded seven birdies and five bogeys
 - Hit 9/13 fairways and 14/18 greens in regulation with 30 putts
 - Her 36-hole 134 is her lowest-ever 36-hole score at a major
 - Her previous major-low was a 136 en route to victory at The Chevron Championship in 2022
 - **Lottie Woad** sits at T12, -5 overall through two rounds
 - One of two amateurs to make the cut
 - Now has a total of 19 points in the LPGA Elite Amateur Pathway
 - Needs a top-25 (and ties) to meet the 20-point threshold and become eligible for LPGA Membership

- Will need to turn professional to join the LPGA; Woad does so immediately, she will have status for the remainder of the 2025 season and all of 2026
- Can also choose to accept membership for only the 2026 season, but Woad will only have status for that calendar year.
- **Yan Liu** was assessed a two-stroke slow play penalty on No. 7 during the second round of The Amundi Evian Championship.

- Third start at the Amundi Evian Championship
 - Finished T17 in 2024 and missed the cut in 2023
- 2025: 13 cuts made in 14 starts, one victory and three additional top-10 finishes
 - Won the Dow Championship with playing partner Jin Hee Im
 - Finished third at the Meijer LPGA Classic for Simply Give and T8 at the KPMG Women's PGA Championship
 - Only missed cut came at the ShopRite LPGA Classic presented by Acer
- Career: One win, five additional top-10 finishes with \$1,760,048 in Official Career Earnings
 - Recorded one top-10 finish in her rookie season in 2024, T5 at the Portland Classic
 - Finished T2 at LPGA Q-Series to earn LPGA Tour membership for the 2024 season
- Five-time winner on the KLPGA

Somi Lee (1, -10) on how she prepared for the Evian Resort Golf Club

"I think first this course is so beautiful, but, you know, green is so tricky, so I'm just practice distance. I'm just focus just distance. Miss left, miss right, never mind. Just distance is perfect. Feel like it's good."

Grace Kim (2, -9) on what she has learned over the years at Evian

"I think the last two years I've played it was definitely a learning experience, and I think for someone to dominate this course and capitalize it, you have to know how this course is going to bite at you. It is very nice to know that I've put together two good rounds. Again, anything can happen, especially on this golf course. Again, we've got nice weather so that's at least one factor out of the list, so it's nice."

Jennifer Kupcho (3, -8) on the strength of her game

"I think just in general I'm a good ball-striker. I think that helps to start. But I think when I was younger I played a bit of a draw and that's really all I could hit. Then switched to a cut, and that's almost all I can hit, but I can still shape it a bit draw-wise. Having played two different ways during my life I've kind of learned how to do both."

Lottie Woad (T12, -5) on making the cut and earning her 19th LEAP point

"Yeah, it's nice. I feel like the first two days usually are a little more stressful. Now I have guaranteed one point and I can play a little bit more freely over the weekend and just try to get that other one."
