 - o Second-round play was first suspended Friday at 10:35 a.m. ET due to thunderstorms and resumed at 12:25 p.m. ET
 - The second suspension came at 1:07 p.m. ET due to thunderstorms and play resumed at 2:04 p.m. ET

- The third suspension came at 3:45 p.m. ET due to thunderstorms and play resumed at 6:18 p.m.

- o Play was ultimately suspended due to darkness at 7:15 p.m.
- 74 players made the cut at -2, notable players to make the cut include:
 - Defending champion Haeran Ryu (-6, T17)
 - o FM Ambassador and Massachusetts native Megan Khang (-4, T31)
 - Last week's CPKC Women's Open champion Brooke Henderson (-5, T25)
 - o 2025 Major Champions:
 - The Chevron Open: Mao Saigo (-2, T56)
 - KPMG Women's PGA Championship: Minjee Lee (-6, T17)
 - AIG Women's Open: Miyu Yamashita (-7, T9)
 - o World No. 1 Jeeno Thitikul (-7, T9) and World No. 2 Nelly Korda (-7, T9)
 - 2025 U.S. Women's Amateur champion and FM Championship sponsor invite Megha Ganne (-2, T56)
- 1: Sei Young Kim leads the field at -14
 - o Kim carded her second consecutive 65 in the second round
 - Played her first four holes on Friday, with a birdie on No. 12 (started on No. 10)
 - Played her final 14 holes on Saturday; recorded birdies on Nos. 14, 15 and 16 before going eagle/birdie/birdie on Nos. 2, 3 and 4
 - Carded her first bogey of the competition on No. 5
 - Hit 13/14 fairways, 14/18 greens in regulation with 26 putts
 - This is her first second-round lead/co-lead on the LPGA Tour this year
 - Last time to lead/co-lead after the second round was at the 2024 Buick LPGA Shanghai, where she ultimately finished T2
 - The last time she went on to win following a second-round lead was at the 2020 The ANNIKA driven by Gainbridge at Pelican
 - Recorded top-15 finishes in her last three starts on Tour:
 - CPKC Women's Open (T10)
 - AIG Women's Open (T13)
 - ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open (T3)
- 2: Miranda Wang sits at -11
 - Carded seven birdies
 - Birdied three of her opening four holes (Nos. 1, 2, 4)
 - Made consecutive birdies on Nos. 16 and 17 before play was suspended for dangerous weather, and then birdied No. 18 upon the resumption of play
 - Hit 10/13 fairways, 13/18 greens in regulation and recorded 26 putts
- 3: Rose Zhang shot the low round of the tournament with an 8-under 64 in the second round
 - Went bogey-free, with eight birdies
 - o Hit 11/13 fairways, 16/18 greens in regulation and recorded 26 putts
 - Last time to shoot 64 during an LPGA Tour tournament was at the 2024 The Standard Portland Classic
 - Her career-low is 63, shot in the first round of her victory at the 2024 Fortinet Founders
 Cup
- 4: Madelene Sagstrom carded a bogey-free 66

- Recorded six birdies including a stretch from Nos. 13-16 despite hitting only 7/14 fairways and 13/18 greens in regulation
- Won the T-Mobile Match Play presented by MGM Rewards earlier in 2025
- Last time to shoot 66 during an LPGA Tour tournament was at the 2024 FIR HILLS SERI PAK Championship
- Defending champion Haeran Ryu sits at T17 after consecutive rounds of 69
 - Ryu holds two tournament scoring records after winning the event in 2024
- FM Ambassador Megan Khang sits at 4-under-par through two rounds
 - o Birdied three of her first five holes (Nos. 10, 12, 14)
 - o Hit 11/14 fairways, 17/18 greens in regulation and recorded 32 putts
 - Hit only 8/14 fairways and 10/18 greens in regulation during her first round
 - o Recorded four rounds in the 70s in last year's FM Championship

QUOTABLE

Sei Young Kim (-14, 1) on how the weather has adjusted her routine and strategy for the week

"Yeah, I play couple holes yesterday. I want to play as much as I can do, but the weather is getting dark so we couldn't play. We can play only four holes. And then we woke up really early morning, like 4:30, and warm up

a little bit. So when I standing on the course, course is really clear and then greens are very clean and then, yeah, when I look at the lie, it's on the line, so course conditions are really good early morning. So I was able to a lot of make the birdie from the green, and then the greens got a lot of rain the last night, yesterday, so I was able to attack the pin. Especially these greens like a lot of release. I was talking to my caddie before the tournament, oh, this course is really so long, so it's tough to make the, yeah, birdie chance. But it's got the rain, so it's a little bit change the strategy this week."

Miranda Wang (-11, 2) on holding her first lead on the LPGA Tour

"My first time in this position, but I'm not unfamiliar with the leaderboard. I will do my best in the weekend and this year we have really strong rookies coming in. It's really competitive. I just want to keep up with the best."

Rose Zhang (-10, 3) on balancing her choice to continue her education at Stanford University while playing on the LPGA Tour

"I think at the end of the day it's something I want to do, it's something that I want to gain for myself. So I am going back this fall just to go back to school; then I'll finish up next winter which is really exciting.

But I would say with all the balance, it requires a lot of patience and dedication, reliance on people around you, but also yourself. So I will say it hasn't been very easy, but it's something that I would do all over again, even though it's quite painful."

Madelene Sagstrom (-9, 4) on how she approached the multiple rain delays during the second round "And then we had our first delay, I came back out, so I was like panic warming up on the range. I came out and I was like, okay, now I'm not hitting it great at all. I tried to stay patient, played a couple holes, and got delayed again. After that I came out. Didn't hit any balls the second time; didn't have time. Hit a few putts and just went out. I was like, let's just be a bit more conservative, play to the center of the greens and just kind of build the momentum up. Hit some lovely shots and lovely putts and was like, well, maybe I should have done this the first time. It was a nice day. It's always hard when momentum changes when you have to go sit inside. You don't know what's it's going to look like, what's going to happen."

Andrea Lee (-8, T5) on her consistency this season, having only missed one cut in 2025

"Yeah, I'm really proud of this season so far. Obviously the goal is to win every week, and I feel like I'm getting closer and closer to that goal, which is always a good thing to see. I love being in contention and I look forward to weekends like this where I have a chance to win a tournament. Yeah, I've had a really consistent season and I'm really proud of that. I think I've made a lot of progress in the last couple years, and it's nice to see that the hard work is paying off. Hopefully one of these tournaments we'll come out on top. I'm just really trying to stay patient and keep playing really solid golf."

Azahara Munoz (-8, T5) on being an LPGA Tour mom, after bringing her son Lucas Vickers into her press conference

"It's really nice. It's something that I've always wanted to do. Like I wanted to be a mom and be on Tour, and hopefully, he's a bit young, but hopefully one day he'll remember being out here and watching me play. It was really nice to see him on the last cheering me on, so it's very special."

Hannah Green (-8, T5) answering LPGA*USGA Girls Golf junior reporter on what tricks she still uses from her time as a junior golfer

"I think just making sure that I'm enjoying myself when I'm out there. I can be quite tough on myself when things aren't going well, so making sure that I'm trying to keep my routine the same as when I'm actually playing good, even if I'm playing bad. Sometimes I think when I was a kid I was really fearless and just wanted to have fun, so trying to embrace that. I think I need to do a little bit more of it and it's paid off so far."

Celine Borge (-8, T5) on how she is adjusting to the varying course conditions

"The greens got a little softer so that probably helped a little. Then it's easy to control. But I felt it was just, I hit the approaches very good, so, yeah, try to do the same tomorrow."

Jeongeun Lee6 (-7, T9) on how she feels to be playing the weekend

"I was struggling with my swing for a few years, but I got new lessons before the two weeks. It was working good right now. It's been a while since I played well before the weekend, so I'm looking forward to playing weekend."
