COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- First: **Chanettee Wannasaen** maintains the lead at 13-under after a second-round 68
 - She made three birdies, one bogey, and one eagle in R2
 - Holed out for eagle on No. 13
 - Her bogey on No. 17 was her first of the week
 - She has hit 30 of 36 greens in regulation, T8 most among the field
 - This is her second 36-hole lead on the LPGA Tour
 - Won the 2024 Dana Open after leading through 36 holes

- Her 131 total through 36 holes matches her career low
 - Also had a 131 total at the 2024 Dana Open
- **T2: Jeeno Thitikul, Charley Hull, and Olivia Cowan** sit in a tie for second at 11-under after 36 holes
 - Thitikul went bogey-free in her second round at TPC River's Bend
 - This is her 10th bogey-free round of the season and 31st of her career
 - She recorded eight birdies in her second round including six on the back-nine
 - Through 36-holes she has 13 birdies ranked T2 among the field
 - This is her second start at the Kroger Queen City Championship
 - She finished runner-up in 2024
 - Hull carded a 7-under 65 in R2
 - She made six birdies, one bogey, and one eagle in the second round
 - Her bogey on No. 14 in R2 was her first of the week
 - Chipped in for eagle on No. 11
 - Her 52 putts through 36 ranks T4 among the field
 - This is her seventh straight made cut
 - WD at The Amundi Evian Championship due to illness
 - Cowan signed for a bogey-free 7-under 65 in the second round
 - Had seven birdies in R2
 - Made four birdies in a row on Nos. 6, 7, 8, and 9
 - Hit 14/14 fairways and 16/18 greens in regulation
 - Hit 14 straight greens in regulation to end her round
 - Hit every fairway and every green in regulation on the back nine
 - Her second round 65 is her lowest round of the season and matches her career low on the LPGA Tour
- **T5: Sei Young Kim, Gigi Stoll, and Maja Stark**
 - Kim recorded five birdies and a bogey in her second round
 - She has 13 birdies through two rounds of play, tied for the second most
 - Kim has competed in all four playings of this event
 - Her best finish is T19 in 2024
 - Kim has finished inside the top-10 in three of her last four starts including two T3 finishes
 - Stoll had seven birdies, two bogeys and a double-bogey in her second round
 - She also has 13 birdies through 36 holes of play
 - She has hit 31 of 36 greens in regulation, T5 most among the field
 - Stoll missed the cut at this event last season
 - She is making her seventh cut of the 2025 season and her first since The Standard Portland Classic
 - Stark made seven birdies and one bogey in R2
 - Joins Kim and Stoll with 13 birdies made through two rounds
 - Her 52 putts ranks T4 among the field
 - This is her third made cut in eight events since winning the U.S. Women's Open presented by Ally
 - This is her first start at the Kroger Queen City Championship presented by P&G
 - Her 66 is her lowest round since her 65 in R1 at the Honda LPGA Thailand

- Defending champion Lydia Ko is 5-under through 36 holes
 - In her second round, she recorded five birdies and a double-bogey
- 77 players made the cut at 2-under or better
- Fiona Xu withdrew prior to her second round
- Karis Davidson withdrew during her second round due to illness
- Lauren Morris withdrew prior to her first round due to injury

 - Has missed the cut in three of her last four starts
 - Representing Thailand at the 2025 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown
- Career: Two career victories, eight top 10s with \$2.7 million in official career earnings
 - Became a Rolex First-Time Winner at the 2023 Standard Portland Classic
 - Won her second time at the 2024 Dana Open
 - She has two wins on the Thai LPGA Tour, both coming in 2022
 - She won at the Singha Pattaya Ladies Open and the SAT-NSDF 5th Thai LPGA Championship
 - She also has one LET Access Series win at the 2022 Trust Golf Link Series – Ramside Hall

QUOTABLE

Chanettee Wannasaen (1, -13) on how her round compared yesterday to today

"Today is really enjoy. Like because I play like so lucky, like a lot of like eagle and chip-in and made the long putt. I think it's so lucky. And today I was so lucky on hole number something, 14 or something. I made eagle, yeah. But I just (indiscernible) when I enjoy play golf, because after AIG I'm out that enjoy play golf. I just told Jan, like can I go back to Thailand? Practice and then go back in? Because I'm not enjoy really, like not really enjoy with that. But this week really enjoy because I can play well like what I think what I want. Maybe like today I miss a lot of short putt but still like enjoy that."

Olivia Cowan (T2, -11) on the key to success on going bogey-free today

"To be honest, just focusing on every shot as comes. Obviously the course is quite tricky. The greens are very undulated and kind of need to hit them in certain spots. So just putting them in the right places and giving myself chances. Yeah, that was really it."

Charley Hull (T2, -11) on how her ankle is holding up

"Yeah, today was actually the first day it feels pretty sore, but it's going to be. It's like my second week on the trot. Obviously coming into like last week I only had like -- I only had done like three weeks before that, so it's a fast turnaround, so obviously going to hurt a little bit. Just got to manage it and not play too much."

Jeeno Thitikul (T2, -11) on what goes on in her head when she's going on long birdie streaks

"Nothing. Pretty much I think I trying to make putts for sure here. I mean, like the green, it's not easy. It's so sloped. And then you need to judge the putt really perfectly to roll it in the hole. And then that four like stretch on the birdies that I have, it's par-5 -- no. It start from 13, right? So I hit pretty good shots on 13 and 15; hit it like two inches, which is like maybe like two free birdies. Otherwise other two I just make putts."

Sei Young Kim (T5, -10) on her flop shot on No. 18

"Yeah, from the second shot I miss it a little, push it. So Jeeno (Thitiku) said, oh, your ball is safe; it's under the tree. So, okay, I have still a chance. I try to just land on the green because where my ball spot is not easy to up and down. Yeah, I got the good luck from there."

Gigi Stoll (T5, -10) on the importance of taking advantage of the par-5s

"Yeah, we have a couple par-5s that are reachable. I think 18 is also reachable. I hit 7-wood today. So I think there is going to be a lot of low scoring on the par-5s this whole week. I think the fairways are drying up a little bit so you're getting more roll on the fairways and then having shorter clubs in. Yeah, I think over the course of the weekend it will just get faster and faster."

Jiwon Jeon (T8, -9) on being in contention heading into the weekend

"Yeah, this week I just try to have fun out there, because I've been like struggling for the last few weeks. I feel like I was trying too hard out there. So this week I was just have this mindset just trying to enjoy the time out there and focus on each shot. If I have a shot, just -- if I have a chance, just go for it. If not, I will just take the outcome, whatever it happens. Anything could happen out there, so just try and accept everything what happens to me. Yeah, I think I'll do the same thing for the rest of the rounds. I feel really grateful that I'm in contention right now. I'll keep trying hard and enjoy out there."

Frida Kinhult (T8, -9) on how she regrouped after the FM Championship to put herself in contention this week
“Again, saw my coach last week a couple times. I think we just tried to reset whole system. Just found like a couple things to think about in the swing. Again, get back into that target focus. I also had a great chat with my mental coach, Marcus, on Monday. Just kind of flip the system around and just get motivation. I think those swing lessons and that chat on Monday brought some good vibes coming in here and trying to make the best out of the end of the year.”
