64 players, divided into 16 groups of four; after three days of round-robin matches, competition moves to a 16-player, single-elimination bracket

SEMIFINAL MATCHES

- No. 13 Lauren Coughlin vs. No. 32 Ariya Jutanugarn
- No. 10 Angel Yin vs. No. 46 Madelene Sagstrom

NOTABLES ABOUT THE SEMIFINALISTS

- There are two players from the United States (Lauren Coughlin and Angel Yin), one player from Thailand (Ariya Jutanugarn) and one player from Sweden (Madelene Sagstrom)
- Yin is the highest ranked player in the Rolex Women's World Golf Rankings (No. 12)
- The average age of the semifinalists is 29.75 years old
 - Angel Yin is the youngest player (26 years old)
- The semifinalists have played a combined 346 holes through the first five rounds
 - Yin 83 holes
 - Jutanugarn 85 holes
 - o Coughlin 90 holes
 - Sagstrom 88 holes

Quarterfinal Results:

• Lauren Coughlin def. Stephanie Kyriacou, 1-up

Of Note:

- Coughlin trailed 3-down twice during her match before tying the match on No. 11
 - o The two stayed tied through Nos. 15 and 16 before Coughlin took the lead on No. 17
- Coughlin advances to the semifinals round for the first time in her career
- Through four days of play, Coughlin has played 90 holes
 - o Each of her five matches this week have gone to 18 holes:
 - R1: 18 holes against Lucy Li
 - R2: 18 holes against Mi Hyang Lee
 - R3: 18 holes against Ina Yoon
 - Playoff for R16: 1 hole against Lucy Li
 - R16: 18 holes against Sei Young Kim
 - QF: 18 holes against Stephanie Kyriacou

Ariya Jutanugarn def. Maja Stark 4 and 2

Of Note:

- Jutanugarn led for 13 of the 16 holes she played and only lost two holes
- This is the second time Jutanugarn has reached the semifinals and the first since 2021
 - o She lost to Ally Ewing 3 and 2
- This was the only match that featured two undefeated players
- Jutanugarn has played 85 holes through five matches

Quarterfinal Results:

• Angel Yin def. Jeeno Thitikul, 4 and 2

Of Note:

- Yin and Thitikul bounced back and forth from Nos. 9-12 before Yin won the next four holes to finish the match
- Thitikul recorded her first loss of the tournament
- Yin has played 83 holes through her first five matches
- Yin advanced to match play last year and lost to Nelly Korda in the quarterfinals in her first event returning from injury

Quarterfinal Results:

• Madelene Sagstrom def. Celine Boutier, 19 holes

Of Note:

- Sagstrom has advanced to the semifinals for the first time in her match play career
 - The furthest she has advanced previously was the quarterfinals before losing to Eun-Hee Ji in 2022
- Neither player has had a lead greater than 1-up in the quarterfinal match
- Boutier played a total of 45 holes on Saturday including her 28-hole match against Ashleigh Buhai
- Their match was suspended due to darkness after the pair arrived on the 18th tee

QUOTABLES

Lauren Coughlin on her putting routine

"Yeah, I do one practice stroke kind of behind it because I'm thinking about my speed, how far back I want to take it. And then I'm kind of getting my line and picking a spot a couple inches in front of the ball. Then I take a big deep breath to try to chill the nerves, kind of -- it kind of can help your nervous system come down a little bit and not be so fight or flight and you can put a little bit better stroke on it. Yeah, and then I step into the ball."

Lauren Coughlin on when she adopted her putting routine

"Pretty much since I started putting really well like around Phoenix or so last year. You know, like Dr, Julie, we talked about stuff like that, Rotella, just always trying to keep you from getting -- tensing up. Again, a deep breath can help your body relax for a second. That's the major thing you have to be when you are trying to putt. You can't be tense. It's already hard enough to put a good stroke on it, and if you're tense who knows what might happen."

Ariya Jutanugarn on her expectations now

"My expectation, make sure I can walk all day tomorrow. That's it. Because like what I said before. Came to this week I didn't feel good at all. I've been working on some stuff and I didn't feel good about my swing. I came this far, it's just like a gift."

Angel Yin on her match against Jeeno Thitikul

"The second one. My chip-in on 13 really helped me feel confident, because the golf course is getting ridiculously hard. Everything is like concrete hard and putts are hard. Like 11 I was downhill, kind of straight, not too much to it, and I just babied it and I was just laughing. You're just so scared at this point because some of the putts can get really, really fast."
