Aon Insight

The 14th hole at Pinnacle CC is a dogleg left par 5 with sloping fairways and slight elevation changes, requiring precision from players throughout the hole, and plays drastically different depending on which tees are in play. Each of the last 3 years, the tees here have been moved up about 76 yards in the final round. Overall, the hole plays 0.34 strokes easier on average when playing from the forward tees. Depending on which tee is in play, players must decide which club to take for their tee shot. Traditionally, the back tees are in use for rounds one and two. From there. players have prioritized position off the tee rather than distance, with less than 30% of players using driver. In the final round, the tees move up more than 70 yards. Players have decided to use driver from that tee 85% of the time, with the hole playing more than one-third of a stroke easier in relation to par.

Aon's Risk Reward Challenge Scoring

One hole is selected at each tournament as the designated Aon Risk Reward Challenge hole for the week (hole is strategically challenging in nature).

For every participating event, a player's best two scores on the designated hole counts towards the season-long leaderboard.

The player with lowest average score under par across the regular season wins the Aon Risk Reward Challenge and will be awarded at the CME Group Tour Championship.

The 2025 season will showcase the continuation of Aon's partnership with the PGA TOUR, which will integrate the use of real-time analytics and capitalize on changes to the TOUR's reimagined 2025 schedule.
