COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- Leader: [Lottie Woad](#) leads the field at an LPGA Tour event for the first time in her young professional career
 - Woad went bogey-free and has the lowest round of the week at 7-under
 - Through 36 holes of play, she has just one bogey
 - She was one of three players to go bogey-free in the second round
 - She recorded seven birdies in her second round, tied for the most among the field
 - She sets both career bests with an 18-hole score of 65 and a 36-hole score of 132
- T2: [Nanna Koerstz Madsen](#) and [Nelly Korda](#)
 - This is the first time Koerstz Madsen is making the cut at this event since 2021
 - She finished T31 that year
 - Her career-best finish at the Women's Scottish Open is T5 in 2020
 - She recorded seven birdies and one bogey in her second round

- Through 36 holes, she has 13 birdies (second) and just one bogey (T1)
- She recorded a double-bogey on No. 15 in her first round
- She has needed just 57 putts, tied for the eighth-fewest putts needed so far this week
- Korda makes the cut in her first start at the ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open
 - Korda has not missed a cut this season in 12 starts
 - Her last missed cut came at the 2024 KPMG Women's PGA Championship
 - She has tied her career record for most cuts consecutive cuts made, done in both 2019 and 2018
 - She leads the field in birdies with 14 over 36 holes
 - She also is tied for the lead in greens hit in regulation with 32 of 36
- Fourth: [Sei Young Kim](#) recorded a 5-under in her second round
 - She recorded her second eagle of the week along with four birdies and a bogey
 - She is the only player to record two eagles in the week
 - Her one bogey is tied for the fewest among the field through 36 holes
 - Kim has never missed a cut at this event and has a career-best T6 finish in 2017
 - Her best finish at Dundonald Links is T24 in 2022
- [Hyo Joo Kim](#) went bogey-free in her second round
 - She was one of three players to go bogey-free in the second round
 - She recorded six birdies
 - She's hit 24 of 28 fairways and 31 of 36 greens in regulation tied for the third-most and fourth-most among the field, respectively
 - Kim has made her sixth cut in seven starts at this event
 - She missed the cut in 2018 and has a career-best finish of runner-up in 2023
- Defending Champion [Lauren Coughlin](#) finished T12 after 36-holes
 - She carded three birdies and two bogeys
- [Gemma Dryburgh](#) fired off a 5-under 67 to move herself to 1-over on the week
 - She is the only Scot to make the cut
 - Her 67 is her best round at this event since the 2022 playing, 66 in the third round
 - Dryburgh is making the cut at the ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open for the fourth time in nine starts
- 71 players made the cut at +1 or better
 - Of those that made the cut, 23 have the opportunity to play their way into the final major of the season, the AIG Women's Open
 - The leading three golfers, who make the cut, not already exempt, in the 2025 ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open will get into the AIG Women's Open
 - Blank entries will be made on behalf of competitors qualifying in this category

ABOUT THE LEADER**Rolex Rankings No. 62 Lottie Woad**

- First start at the ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open
- 2025: First official start on the LPGA Tour as a member
 - Has appeared in three major championships as a non-member this season
 - Finished T3 at The Amundi Evian Championship, T31 at the U.S. Women's Open presented by Ally and missed the cut at The Chevron Championship
 - Woad became the first athlete to earn LPGA Tour status via the LPGA Elite Amateur Pathway in July 2025 when she tied for third at The Amundi Evian Championship
 - She won the 2025 KPMG Women's Irish Open as an amateur on the Ladies European Tour
 - Woad appeared in seven LPGA Tour major championships as an amateur across the 2024 and 2025 seasons
- Amateur: Woad played collegiately at Florida State University
 - During her time as a Seminole, Woad was named the 2023 ACC Freshman of the Year, was named a WCGA All-American three times (2023-25) and was the 2024 ACC Golfer of the Year
 - Woad was the WCGA Co-Freshman of the Year in 2023 and was the Golden Nole - Female Athlete of the Year in 2024
 - Woad became the first Englishwoman to win the Mark H. McCormack Medal in August 2024, an award given to the athlete who is ranked No. 1 in the World Amateur Golf Ranking at the conclusion of what's considered to be the elite amateur season
 - She won the 2024 Augusta National Women's Amateur, the first European to ever win the championship

Lottie Woad (1, -12) on getting to play with Nelly Korda and Charley Hull in her professional debut

“Yeah, it's been great. Obviously got good crowds as well. Everyone was playing pretty well, so that was nice. Obviously people I've looked up to, so to play alongside them was really cool.”

Nelly Korda (T2, -10) on her second round

“Yeah. I started out strong with two birdies on my first two holes, and then the wind kind of died down throughout the day, so capitalized on the weather. Yeah, just hit it really well and I have only missed four greens through two days so happy with that. Hopefully I can continue trending in the right direction.”

Nanna Koerstz Madsen (T2, -10) on her getting used to this course in her fourth-straight start

“Yeah, my dad actually said before I got here that this must be the tournament that I played the most on because I played as a junior as well one of the -- whatever tournaments we played back then. So I definitely know this course very well, yeah.”

Sei Young Kim (4, -9) on her second chip-in for eagle this week

“Yes. I had a good happen yesterday that I made an eagle from 75 yard and also today hole 18 I made a chip-in and eagle. Yeah, it's feel great.”

Gemma Dryburgh (T59, +1) on her bogey-free round to make the cut

“Yeah, obviously got off to a nice start with a birdie on the 10th hole there, my first hole. Kind of needed a hot start today and needed to go low. My caddie just said to me, what's the lowest round you played in Scotland? I don't know what it is, but I said 5- or 6-under. One them today would do. Yeah, good.”
