AIG Women's Open

*Each of the last four times this championship was played at Royal Lytham and St Annes, the winner was -6 or better for the week on the par fives.

*Only one of the last nine winners of the AIG Women's Open has been ranked in the top ten in the world at the time of her victory (Lilia Vu, 6th in 2023).

*Charley Hull is a combined 16-under-par at this championship since 2022, eight strokes better than any other player with a dozen or more rounds played in that span.

*Players with the most strokes gained total per round at the AIG Women's Open over the last five years (min. 12 rounds played): Charley Hull (2.17), Lilia Vu (2.13) and Hyo Joo Kim (2.06).

*Players with the best cumulative score to par in the majors this season, regardless of number of rounds played: Haeran Ryu (-36 in 12 rounds), Nelly Korda (-31 in 14 rounds) and Brooke Henderson (-25 in 16 rounds). Henderson has the best score among players to make all four major cuts in 2026.

*Since the beginning of the 2021 season, Nelly Korda leads all players in the major championships in wins (4), top five finishes (8), top 10 finishes (12), score to par (-68), rounds under par (58) and strokes gained total per round (2.11).

*Since 2018, Korda has four wins, nine top five finishes and has averaged 2.26 strokes gained per round in the three U.S.-based major championships. In the two based in Europe, she has just one top-five and averages 1.42 strokes gained total per round.

*Korda is 68-under-par in the majors since the beginning of 2021, 13 strokes better than any other player in that span (Hyo Joo Kim, -55).

*Only Korda (12) has more top-ten finishes in majors since the beginning of 2021 than Jeeno Thitikul (11), yet Jeeno is still looking for her first major win.

*When Haeran Ryu won the Amundi Evian Championship, she became the first player to get her first two major wins in consecutive majors contested since Lydia Ko (2015 Evian, 2016 Chevron).

*Charley Hull led all players in one-putts (37), putts per GIR (1.63) and ranked second in strokes gained putting (9.70) at the 2025 AIG Women's Open.

*Four of the last six defending champions at the AIG Women's Open have missed the cut.

*Over the last two majors, only Ryu (-32) has a better cumulative score to par than Brooke Henderson (-29).
