Wednesday – Light fog will remain in the area this morning through 8am. Mostly cloudy skies are then expected through the morning. Into the afternoon, southeasterly winds will bring in additional moisture that may lead to scattered pop-up thunderstorms. These thunderstorms would likely be more progressive than the rain on Tuesday and may quickly lead to 0.25” of rain. Temperatures will be warmer with temperatures reaching the mid 70s. The highest chance for any thunderstorm is around 4-6pm.

Extended forecast – Relief from rain and thunderstorms is expected Thursday through Sunday. A drier pattern moves in with low chances of afternoon pop-up showers and thunderstorms each day. A sea breeze pattern is expected with the winds. Winds will begin light each morning and then S-SE winds around 10mph are expected in the afternoon with most wind gusts near 20mph and a few 25mph possible each day. Warmer weather is expected with high temperatures increasing into the mid 80s by the end of the weekend. Each morning Thursday-Sunday, light fog is possible in the morning.
