Today – Cooler conditions have returned this morning with calm winds and mostly sunny skies to hold after sunrise. By this afternoon, west to northwesterly winds are forecast to slightly increase across the area. High temperatures will warm to the mid 20s (C) with a slight chance for a passing shower or storm late in the day. Towards sunset, winds will begin to decline with temperatures to follow suit.

Extended forecast – Later Thursday, a disturbance may bring increased chances for scattered showers and isolated storms. A brief period of drier conditions is likely to occur Friday before increased chances of showers and isolated storms return later in the weekend as an area of low-pressure drifts nearby. Outside of precipitation, winds will briefly flow from the south Friday into Saturday before switching back to the west-northwest Sunday; occasional breezy winds are possible though will favor open areas. Daily high temperatures will persist in the mid 20s (C) with overnight lows in the mid teens (C). Additionally, slight chances for patchy fog may continue through mid-week with any development to burn-off through the mid-morning.
