COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- Leader: **Miyu Yamashita** went bogey-free in her first round
 - Carded eight birdies, four on each nine
 - Recorded only 25 putts
 - Second fewest across the field
 - Her 62 is a career-low round on the LPGA Tour
 - Previous lowest was a 64 during the final round of the 2026 Meijer LPGA Classic for Simply Give and the 2026 Kroger Queen City Championship
 - This is the lowest round recorded on the LPGA Tour at Royal Mayfair Golf Club
 - Previous best was a 64 recorded by **Kathleen Ekey**, **Caroline Hedwall**, and **Lydia Ko** in 2013
 - Ko went on to win the event
 - This is her first appearance at the CPKC Women's Open
 - This is her third time leading or co-leading after the first round

- Led after the first round at the 2026 Aramco Championship and 2025 TOTO Japan Classic
- 2nd: **Nasa Hataoka** carded eight birdies and a bogey in her opening round
 - Hit 16/18 greens in regulation
 - Her eight birdies are tied for the most in the field during R1
 - This is her lowest score of the 2026 LPGA Tour season by two strokes
 - This is her lowest opening round since the 2023 CME Group Tour Championship (63)
 - Has never finished outside the top-40 at this tournament
 - Previous best finish was T-5 in 2019
 - Best finish this season is T-5 at the Fortinet Founders Cup
- 3rd: **Kiara Romero** recorded a 6-under-par 64 in her first round as a professional
 - [Earned her LPGA Tour card last week through LEAP](#)
 - Went bogey-free with six birdies
 - One of five players with a bogey-free round
 - Recorded only 27 putts and had an average drive distance of 300 yards
 - Second longest drive distance across the field
 - Played in 10 LPGA Tour events as an amateur
 - Her 64 is the lowest opening round as a professional or amateur
 - Shot a final round 64 in 2025 at The Standard Portland Classic as an amateur
 - Finished T6 at the 2026 U.S. Women's Open
 - Finished T36 at this event last year
 - Earned her spot in the field by finishing in the top-10 of the 2025 The Standard Portland Classic

 - Won the Meijer LPGA Classic for Simply Give
 - Missed the cut in her last start (AIG Women's Open)
 - Made 10 consecutive cuts before the missed cut
- Career: Three wins, one major championship, 20 top 10s, and \$5.5M in official career earnings
 - Won the 2025 AIG Women's Open to become a first-time major winner
 - 2025 Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the Year

- Represented Japan in the 2024 Paris Olympics (T4) and in the 2025 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown
- Earned medalist honors at Final Qualifying of LPGA Q-Series in 2024 to earn LPGA Tour membership

“So it's been a while since I finished the first round in good position, so I was able to make some putts as well. So I'm pretty happy with how I played.”

Nasa Hataoka (2nd, -7) on how the course was playing in round one

“No wind today and so many mosquitoes, and -- but fairway was not firm and green's really good shape so I could make so many birdie chances today.”

Kiara Romero (3rd, -6) on how she felt in her first round as a professional

“I'm really happy about it. I think I honestly came out here today just like with one goal: To just go out there and have fun and just play with as little pressure as possible, and that's exactly what I did.”

Ruoning Yin (T4, -5) on how her game feels after the first round

“I think today obviously I had a good start and this is my first time shooting 20s. I mean, everything works well. I think I work on my putting for so long and then my long game feels good. I think right now I got all the pieces and just try to puzzle them together.”

Anna Huang (T4, -5) on what it would mean to make the cut at the CPKC Women's Open

“I think I'm going to just try to take it one shot at a time and see how things go, and trusting my process. So, yeah, definitely making the cut would be a really big goal for me, and then hopefully some good weekend golf.”

Gina Kim (T8, -4) on her eagle on Hole 3

“Yeah, I mean, we obviously had a really good number. I think it was like 123 or something like that, but it was a perfect pitching and it was going straight at the hole. My eyesight is not that great, so I didn't even realize it went in, and then the volunteers went crazy.”
