COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- Winner: **Haeran Ryu**
 - Wins her second major of the season and her career
 - Joins **Nelly Korda** as the only other major champion this season
 - Earns her fifth career victory and is the first time she has won twice in the same season
 - Made a birdie on the 72nd hole to force a playoff
 - Made birdie on the first playoff hole to defeat **Brooke Henderson**
 - Her 265 total is the lowest score in her career at a major championship
 - Becomes the first Korean to win this event since **Jin Young Ko** in 2019
 - Is the third player from the Republic of Korea to win at least two majors in a single season since The Amundi Evian Championship was elevated to a major championship in 2013
 - Joins Ko and **Inbee Park** who won two majors in 2015 and three in 2013

- Park won the KPMG Women's PGA Championship and the AIG Women's Open
 - Park won three majors in 2013
 - Her 60 in R3 is the lowest 18-hole score at a major championship in LPGA Tour history
- Second: **Brooke Henderson**
 - Shot a 7-under 64 for the second straight day
 - Made three eagles in her final round, including an ace
 - Made an eagle on the 72 hole to force a playoff with **Haeran Ryu**
 - Her six eagles this week were the most in any tournament in LPGA Tour history
 - This is her second straight top 3 finish
 - Has made the cut in every major championship this season
- Third: **Aki Iwai**
 - Shot a 2-under 69 in her final round
 - Made a double bogey on her third hole then played the rest of the round bogey-free at 4-under
 - Missed a birdie putt on the 72nd hole to join the playoff with **Brooke Henderson** and **Haeran Ryu**
 - This is her best finish and score at a major championship
- **Farah O'Keefe** is the low amateur at T35 after a final round 69
 - Won low amateur by one shot over Yunseo Yang
 - Her second low amateur honors at a major championship this season
 - Was low amateur at The Chevron Championship
 - This was her first start at The Amundi Evian Championship
 - Now has finished top 40 in her last three major championship starts
 - T34 at the U.S. Women's Open presented by Ally, T38 at The Chevron Championship
 - Now has 17 LPGA Elite Amateur Pathway (LEAP) points with her made cut

- Fifth start at The Amundi Evian Championship
 - 2026 – WIN, 2025 – MC, 2024 – 5th, 2023 – T42, 2018 – MC*
 - *As a non-member
- 2026: 11 cuts made in 12 starts, one major championship and six additional top 10 finishes
 - Won the KPMG Women's PGA Championship in her previous start

- Is the first player from the Republic of Korea to win two majors in a single season since **Jin Young Ko** in 2019
 - Ko won The Chevron Championship and The Amundi Evian Championship
- Tied for the shortest amount of time between major championship victories at 13 days
 - Joins **Meg Mallon**, who won the U.S. Women's Open and Mazda LPGA Championship 13 days apart
- Her only missed cut came at the Aramco Championship
- Career: Five wins, two major championships, 32 top 10s with \$9.9M in official career earnings
 - Was named the Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the Year in 2023
 - Sixth player from the Republic of Korea since 2015 to earn the honor
 - Represented the Republic of Korea at the 2025 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown
 - Was a five-time winner on the KLPGA between 2019 and 2022
 - Named the KLPGA Rookie of the Year in 2020

QUOTABLE

Haeran Ryu (1st, -19) on how hard it is to win back-to-back majors

"Yeah, it's so tough, so hard. Yesterday my score is 11-under par. It's so amazing score. But today just even, one bogey and one birdie and that's it. This is golf. It's too different. So that's why it is so can enjoy golf, but this is stressful for the players. So, yeah, but I don't have over par during this week, so, yeah, it works and then I'm so happy."

Brooke Henderson (2nd, -19) on all the excitement coming down the stretch

"Yeah, played awesome today, which is really exciting. To finish second in a major and third couple week ago, definitely game is in a really good spot. Obviously very exciting to get into the playoff. Wish I had played a little bit better, but Haeran has been playing great. Congrats to her. I am happy how I played. Lots of birdies and eagles, which is really fun."

Aki Iwai (3rd, -18) on how this will help her going forward

"Yes. Definitely I got confidence, so, yeah some win, some lose, right? But, yes, good experience for AIG, good lesson."

Jin Hee Im (T4, -15) on what she will work on in the weeks before the AIG Women's Open

"I go back to Korea, like two weeks, so ready for AIG. So they're really different, really cold and windy. Need to change something to my mind, and trying to like lower flight and then kind of like practice long putt."

Lydia Ko (T7, -13) on her grade for her husband who was caddying for her this week

"He was A+ for I think me personally. Would it be an A+ for other players? I'm not really sure. But obviously he can say some things that only a husband can say and maybe not Paul for me on a week to week. But he was great. I think when I started off the championship with a bogey on the first and he was like, hey, it's okay. You

can do this. Just having him on the bag, like he felt like he was carrying his clubs and like playing on the weekend, and honestly felt like for me, too, like any other day we play together on the weekend. We had a lot of fun. I think having him on the bag has made me realize like how tough of a job a caddie really is. It made me become more appreciative of Paul who does it for -- who we work together, and all of the other caddies. I'm not sure how they kind of go through those physical and mental I guess strenuous situations I guess week in, week out. Having him has made me more appreciative of their job I guess, yeah."

Farah O'Keefe (T35, -5) on earning another LEAP point this week

"Huge motivator. I had a couple putts on my last two holes today that I knew if I made those I would get an additional point, so I missed both of them low side and I was kind of bummed. But yeah, that's something I'm chasing. In the back of my mind all the time. I think more than anything it's a motivator to go work really hard and make sure that I'm focusing on all the right things and doing everything that I can do, because the rest kind of takes care of itself. Soon as I can control everything that I can control, everything else is kind of taken care of."
