COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- Leader: **Haeran Ryu**
 - Her 60 is the lowest 18-hole score at a major championship in LPGA Tour history
 - Ninth 60 in LPGA Tour history
 - Second 60 of the 2026 season
 - First 60 in Evian Championship history, and in a major championship since LPGA records began tracking rounds of 60
 - After only seven 60s in the Tour's first 74 years, there have now been four since the start of the 2024 season (Linnea Ström, Lucy Li, Lydia Ko and Haeran Ryu)
 - Set a new tournament scoring record with her third round 60
 - Set a new career-best 18-hole score
 - Her previous best was 62 at the 2024 FM Championship in the final round

- Has 18 birdies through 54 holes, tied for the second-most among the field
 - Led the field in birdies in round three with 9
- Tied her career-best 54-hole score at 194
 - She last did so in her first career victory at the Walmart NW Arkansas Championship
- **Second: Aki Iwai**
 - The 197 total is the lowest 54-hole total in her LPGA Tour career
 - Previous best was The Standard Portland Classic last season with a 198
 - Went on to win the event
 - Leads the field in birdies with 21
 - Is her best position heading into the final round of a major championship
- **T3: Brooke Henderson and Mao Saigo**
 - Henderson carded a back nine 30 on her way to a third round 64
 - Her 64 is her lowest round in a major championship since The Chevron Championship in 2022, where she also shot a 64
 - This is her third time shooting a 64 at The Amundi Evian Championship
 - Shot back-to-back rounds of 64 in 2022 and went on to win the event
 - This is the second time this season she has had two eagles in the same round
 - Also had two eagles at The Evian Championship in 2024
 - Saigo shot a 4-under 67 in R3
 - The 197 total is her lowest 54-hole total in a major championship
 - Previous best was 205 at The Amundi Evian Championship in 2022
 - Her two bogeys are tied for the fewest in the field with **Cara Gainer**
 - Is one of five players to have three rounds in the 60s
- **Yunseo Yang and Farah O'Keefe** are tied as the lowest amateurs at T40
 - Yang recorded a -3 round
 - She is making her second start on the LPGA Tour
 - Finished T38 at the 2026 Chevron Championship
 - Yang is coming off her best finish as an amateur
 - Finished runner-up at the Mercedes-Benz 40th Korea Women's Open Golf Championship on the KLPGA
 - No. 15 ranked amateur
 - O'Keefe also shot a third round 68
 - Making her first start at The Amundi Evian Championship
 - Has finished top 40 in her last two major championship starts
 - T34 at the U.S. Women's Open presented by Ally, T38 at The Chevron Championship
 - Has 16 LPGA Elite Amateur Pathway (LEAP) points
 - Earns her 17th with a made cut OR
 - Earns her 18th with a top 25 finish

WITH A WIN

Haeran Ryu

- Would win her second major of the season and her career
 - Would join Nelly Korda as the only other major champion this season

- Would be the first player from the Republic of Korea to win two majors in a single season since **Jin Young Ko** in 2019
 - Ko won The Chevron Championship and The Amundi Evian Championship
- Would be the third player from the Republic of Korea to win at least two majors in a single season since The Amundi Evian Championship was elevated to a major championship in 2013
 - Joins Ko and **Inbee Park** who won two majors in 2015 and three in 2013
 - Park won the KPMG Women's PGA Championship and the AIG Women's Open
 - Park won three majors in 2013
- Would be the eighth player from Korea to win at least two major championships
- Would be the first Korean to win this event since Ko in 2019
- Would earn her fifth career victory on the LPGA Tour

Aki Iwai

- Would earn her first career major championship
- Would be the seventh player from Japan to earn a major championship
- Would be the fifth different Japanese player in the last five seasons to win a major championship
- Would earn her second career victory
 - First since the 2025 Standard Portland Classic
- Would be the second Japanese player to win The Amundi Evian Championship
 - First since **Ayaka Furue** in 2023
- Would cross the \$1 million mark in season earnings for the second time in her career
- Would be the 11th player from Japan to cross the \$3 million mark in official career earnings

- Fifth start at The Amundi Evian Championship
 - 2025 – MC, 2024 – 5th, 2023 – T42, 2018 – MC*
 - *As a non-member
- 2026: 11 cuts made in 12 starts, one major championship and six additional top 10 finishes
 - Won the KPMG Women's PGA Championship in her last start
 - Her only missed cut came at the Aramco Championship
- Career: Four wins, one major championship, 31 top 10s with \$8.5M in official career earnings
 - Was named the Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the Year in 2023

- Sixth player from the Republic of Korea since 2015 to earn the honor
- Represented the Republic of Korea at the 2025 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown
- Was a five-time winner on the KLPGA between 2019 and 2022
 - Named the KLPGA Rookie of the Year in 2020

QUOTABLE

Haeran Ryu (1st, -19) on if she knew her final putt was for a 59

“No. I never know because, I don't know here is par 71. That's why I just hit it -- I just -- I don't my score on the green today, so that's why I don't know on the hole 18. But after the putt and I counted my score with my caddie, oh, my God, it's 11-under par today. It was so amazing. My caddie says, yep. Yeah, I'm so happy right now.”

Aki Iwai (2nd, -16) on what it meant to make the cut

“Oh, so actually last year I missed the cut, and so I want revenge. That's why. Yeah, really optimistic tomorrow. I just keep going.”

Brooke Henderson (T3, -16) on having two chip-in eagles

“Yeah, definitely a bonus to be able to chip in on two par-5s today, two eagles. Definitely helps out the scorecard a lot, and momentum, too. You know, on both of them I was in pretty good spots, and so to see them go in is definitely very exciting. But I feel like the par-5s are pretty key here, so hopefully have a good day on them tomorrow.”

Casandra Alexander (5th, -11) on her finishing stretch

“No. I actually didn't have a look at the leaderboard at all. I didn't know where I was or what I was doing. I was just trying to play the best I could. It was a bit of a terrible tee shot; missed it on the wrong side on 17. And then 18 the same thing. So two, I would say, silly mistakes. And it wasn't the only ones I made today. I just recovered really well. Made a lot of up and downs from certain places. So, yeah, I wouldn't say it was nervy at all. It was just, yeah, misses.”

Anna Huang (-6, T16) on playing in her first Amundi Evian Championship

“Yeah, I was definitely a bit nervous before making the cut. First two days were -- they're always a bit nerve-wracking. Then I think today I really kind of loosened up and the nerves kind of went away. So I just played freely.”
