COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- 67 players made the cut at even par or better. Notables to miss the cut include:
 - European Solheim Cup Team players: Linn Grant, Celine Boutier, Julia Lopez Ramirez, Carlota Ciganda, Esther Henseleit, Chiara Tamburlini, Mimi Rhodes
 - U.S. Solheim Cup Team players: Jennifer Kupcho, Auston Kim, Yealimi Noh, Andrea Lee, Angel Yin
 - Amateur Paula Martin Sampedro, Zoe Jiamanukoonkit
 - Local Alexa Pano
- Leaders: **Allisen Corpuz**, **Hyo Joo Kim** and **Miyu Yamashita** are tied at 9-under par through two rounds
 - Corpuz recorded a bogey-free 67 on Friday
 - Had four birdies in her last six holes of the front nine
 - T2 amongst the field in greens in regulation hit over the past two days (30/36)
 - Second time in her career that she has led or co-led going into the weekend at an LPGA Tour event
 - Led the field after the second round of the 2022 ANNIKA driven by Gainbridge at Pelican

- Qualified for the 2026 U.S. Solheim Cup Team through the points standings; will head to The Netherlands
- Kim shot a 5-under 67 in R2
 - Had two sets of back-to-back birdies on holes 1 and 2, and 7 and 8
 - Made one bogey on the par-4 5th; was her only bogey through 36 holes
 - Had the least amount of putts amongst the field on Friday with 24
 - Second time this season that she has led or co-led going into the weekend
 - Led the field following the second round of the 2026 Fortinet Founders Cup, which she would go onto win
- Yamashita followed her opening round of 65 with a 2-under 70
 - Had four birdies and two bogeys on Friday including back-to-back birdies on holes 16 and 17
 - Has recorded the most birdies of any player in the field through two rounds (14)
 - Has recorded the least amount of putts of any player in the field through two rounds (51)
 - Also held the lead going into Saturday at the CPKC Women's Open last week and won
- **T4: Morgane Metraux, Ruoning Yin and Jenny Bae**
 - Metraux and Yin tied the low round of the day at 7-under
 - Metraux's 65 is her lowest 18-hole score since the 2022 season
 - This is just her fifth round in the 60s this season
 - This is her lowest round at the FM Championship, previous 67
 - This is the second time she has made the cut at this event
 - She went bogey-free with five birdies and an eagle
 - This is the second bogey-free round of the season and the ninth of her career
 - Her 123 is her lowest 36-hole score since the 2023 season
 - Yin led the field in birdies with eight
 - Her 65 is tied for her lowest round of the season
 - Shot 65 at the first round of the CPKC Women's Open
 - This is her first start at the FM Championship
 - She is second among the field in birdies through 36 holes with 13
 - She hit all 18 greens in regulation in her second round becoming the first player to do so multiple times this season
 - Hit all 18 greens in regulation in final round of the Mizuho Americas Open
 - Bae leads the field in greens in regular having only missed three
 - She has had just two bogeys, tied for the fourth-fewest
 - Second time this season she has opened with back-to-back rounds in the 60s
 - Her best start at this event
 - Shot 69-72 in 2025
- **Anna Nordqvist** made the cut at 2-under after a second-round 68
 - Nordqvist announced earlier this week her [retirement from the LPGA Tour](#)
 - She was 2-over after her first round
- **Weiwei Zhang** withdrew during her second round due to injury

ABOUT THE LEADERS

Rolex Rankings No. 45 Allisen Corpuz

- Third start at the FM Championship
 - Finished T4 in 2024 and T20 in 2025
- 2026: Four top-10 finishes with 12 cuts made in 16 starts
 - Two top-10 finishes were at major championships this year; U.S. Women's Open presented by Ally (T8) and KPMG Women's PGA Championship (T5)
- Career: One career victory, 17 top-10 finishes with \$6.5 million in earnings
 - Won the 2023 U.S. Women's Open presented by Ally
 - Has played on two U.S. Solheim Cup Teams (2023, 2024) and will make her third appearance in less than two weeks
- Finished T16 at the 2021 LPGA Q-Series to earn Membership
- Played collegiately at the University of Southern California

Rolex Rankings No. 4 Hyo Joo Kim

- First start at the FM Championship
- 2026: Two wins and five top-10 finishes in 14 starts
 - Won in back-to-back weeks at the Fortinet Founders Cup and Ford Championship presented by Wild Horse Pass
 - Also finished runner-up at the Dow Championship
 - Has only missed one cut this season at the U.S. Women's Open presented by Ally
- Career: 9 career victories including one major championship, 68 top 10s and \$13.1M in official career earnings
 - Has won at least once in each of her last five seasons on the LPGA Tour except 2024
 - Represented the Republic of Korea at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics (T15) and the 2024 Paris Olympics (T25)
 - Represented the Republic of Korea at the 2023 and 2025 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown
 - Won the 2014 Amundi Evian Championship as a non-Member and accepted Membership for the following season
 - 14-time KPGA Tour winner

Rolex Rankings No. 5 Miyu Yamashita

- Second start at the FM Championship

- Finished T7 in 2025
- 2026: Two wins and nine top-10 finishes in 17 starts
 - Won last week's CPKC Women's Open for her fourth LPGA Tour victory in two years
 - Missed just two cuts this year – Ford Championship presented by Wild Horse Pass and AIG Women's Open
- Career: 4 career victories including one major championship, 21 top 10s and \$5.9M in official career earnings
 - 2025 Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the Year
 - Represented Japan at the 2024 Paris Olympics (T4) and at the 2025 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown
 - Medalist at the 2024 LPGA Q-Series to earn Membership
- 13-time JLPGA Tour winner
 - JLPGA Player of the Year in 2022 and 2023

QUOTABLES

Allisen Corpuz (T1, -9) on going bogey-free at TPC Boston

"Yeah, I think this is a course that I've just come to and it looks good to my eye. I've been hitting the ball really well and putting myself in the right spots; even when I missed had a good look at a good up and down for par. I think this course is just one you just stay patient and you'll get the opportunities as they come. Yeah, me and Jay just did a good job of, yeah, staying patient. Especially the wind picked up a bit when at the started the round. So, yeah, it's just a course that's kind of always looked good to me and I'm really excited for the weekend."

Hyo Joo Kim (T1, -9) on starting her tournament with 30-straight bogey-free holes

"(Through translation.) There are many situations even yesterday I could have bogeyed but I think there was just a lot of saves. So that's why I was able to have a bogey-free round."

Morgan Metraux (T4, -8) on what went well during her bogey-free in her second round

"I think multiple things. I think I drove the ball really well. I hit I don't know how many fairways, but pretty much all of them I think, or close to that. Then I hit some really solid iron shots. I was playing conservative when I had to. Some of the pins out there are pretty tough, especially on the back nine, so I was playing conservative when I needed to. Just two putted from distance, and then when it was a green light flag, I was able to attack really well. I just missed like three greens I think. One was just barely off and then I made an up and down into two others. So kept it mistake-free."

Ruoning Yin (T4, -8) on what makes this course so scorable

"I think the green is a little soft. I don't know. This year is my first year play this tournament and people has been saying the green was really, really firm last year. But I think this year it's pretty soft and you can stop the ball pretty quickly and it's not that long and there is two par-5s I think is reachable, so, yeah."

Jenny Bae (T4, -8) on her solid round

"I think today was really similar to yesterday. I think though both went really well. My caddie and I, we kind of decided to tweak on a few things. And I had a rough couple of tournaments, but I'm really happy that I'm trending back up, so hopefully the weekend goes well."

Suvichaya Vinijchaitham (T9, -6) on her five-straight birdies

"I just made putts. That's it. Hit fairway, greens, and made putts. I would say like it was kind of lucky a little bit. Like it was not like short putts. There were some long putts, too."

Anna Nordqvist (T32, -2) on her mindset heading into potentially her last round of golf ever

"I couldn't really sleep last night. I think I woke up at 2:00 and it was just like a lot of emotions. I guess I've always wanted to finish on a high. Playing good yesterday, just being in those really gusty winds, being hard to score, get close to the holes, I feel like it was just one of those days; like really determined to try to do everything I can to be able to play the weekend, too."
