COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- **Hyo Joo Kim** opened with a nine-under 63 in R1
 - Hit 10/14 fairways, 13/18 greens in regulations with 22 putts
 - Least number of putts across the field
 - This is the second time this season she has had 22 or fewer putts in a round
 - Also had 22 putts in round 2 at the Honda LPGA Thailand

- First round on U.S. soil since the 2023 Ascendant LPGA where she had 22 putts or less
 - Her last two holes were birdie, eagle
 - This is the first time in her LPGA Tour career (over 750 career rounds) she has finished a round birdie, eagle or eagle, birdie
 - Is the defending champion at next week's Ford Championship presented by Wild Horse Pass
- Rookie **Dongeun Lee** opened with a seven-under 65, recording her lowest round on the LPGA Tour in her second start of the 2026 season
 - Finished T7 at the 2025 LPGA Q-Series, Final Qualifying to earn LPGA Tour Status for the 2026 season
 - Had one LPGA start before becoming a member at the 2025 AIG Women's Open where she missed the cut
- There are four Stanford players **Aline Krauter**, **Andrea Lee**, **Albane Valenzuela** and **Rose Zhang** in the field. Each player shot under-par on Thursday.
 - Zhang opened with one-under par 71

 - Will walk at graduation in June
