COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- T1: **Lydia Ko** and **Lottie Woad** sit at 8-under par after R2
 - Ko shot a bogey-free 67 with five birdies
 - Has the lowest amount of putts (52) over the first two days of play
 - Is the only player that has not recorded a bogey in the first 36 holes
 - Hit 7/14 fairways and 12/18 greens in regulation on Friday
 - One of two LPGA players in the field that are members of Lake Nona including **Nasa Hataoka**
 - Woad carded a 69 on Friday
 - Had four birdies and one bogey
 - Her one bogey was due to a three-putt on No. 9

- **T3: Amy Yang and Nasa Hataoka** are one shot behind the leaders at 7-under par
 - Yang shot a 69 with four birdies and one bogey
 - Hit 13/14 fairways and 15/18 greens in regulation with 30 putts
 - Her last two starts were The ANNIKA driven by Gainbridge at Pelican and the LOTTE Championship; did not qualify for the CME Group Tour Championship
 - Hataoka shot a second-round 71
 - Made three birdies and two bogeys
 - One of the two Lake Nona members in the field including **Lydia Ko**
- Defending champion **A Lim Kim** is tied for 5th at 6-under par total
 - Recorded a bogey-free 69 in R2
 - Has recorded six-straight rounds in the 60s at this event
- **Aaron Hicks** leads the celebrity field with 78 points in the Modified Stableford format
 - Recorded an eagle, seven birdies and three bogeys to shoot 66
 - Two-time winner Mardy Fish trails closely behind with 76 points

ABOUT THE LEADERS

Rolex Rankings No. 6 Lydia Ko

- Fifth start at the Hilton Grand Vacations Tournament of Champions
 - Has finished inside the top 10 in all four of her previous starts
 - Won this event in 2024
 - Is a Lake Nona resident and Hilton Grand Vacations ambassador
- First start of the 2026 season
- First joined the LPGA Tour in 2014
 - Has 23 career victories including three major championships
 - Was inducted into the LPGA Hall of Fame in 2024 following her gold medal at the 2024 Paris Olympics
 - She is the youngest player to be inducted into the LPGA Hall of Fame under the current criteria
 - She is the first player to be inducted into the LPGA Hall of Fame since Lorena Ochoa in 2022
 - Multi-time LPGA Tour Award Winner
 - 2014 Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the Year (Youngest-Ever Winner), Race to CME Globe Winner

- 2015 Rolex Player of the Year (Youngest-Ever Winner), Race to CME Globe Winner, Tour Money Winner
- 2016 Rolex Annika Major Award
- 2021 Founders Award, Vare Trophy
- 2022 Rolex Player of the Year, Vare Trophy, Race to CME Globe Winner

Rolex Rankings No. 11 Lottie Woad

- First appearance at the Hilton Grand Vacations Tournament of Champions
 - Won the 2025 ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open to qualify
- First start of the 2026 season
- Became the first athlete to earn LPGA Tour status via the LPGA Elite Amateur Pathway in July 2025 when she tied for third at The Amundi Evian Championship
- Was a decorated amateur at Florida State University
 - Was named the 2023 ACC Freshman of the Year, was named a WCGA All-American three times (2023-25) and was the 2024 ACC Golfer of the Year
 - Became the first Englishwoman to win the Mark H. McCormack Medal in August 2024, an award given to the athlete who is ranked No. 1 in the World Amateur Golf Ranking at the conclusion of what's considered to be the elite amateur season
- Won the 2025 KPMG Women's Irish Open as an amateur on the Ladies European Tour

QUOTABLES

Lydia Ko (T1, -8) on how tough it is to go bogey-free back-to-back rounds at this course

“Yeah, I'm not really sure if I had a bogey-free round at some point last year. It was a little bit more calm in the years before. Regardless of how many bogeys I make the rest of the season it's always nice to have a couple bogey-free rounds and just keep the good momentum going. Yeah, I've had to hole some good par putts but I really haven't put myself in that many difficult positions as of yet. I think that's why I had the two bogey-free rounds. I'm hoping to kind of continue that good momentum this weekend.”

Lottie Woad (T1, -8) on how to not get frustrated on the course when putts aren't dropping

“Yeah, I looked at the leaderboard quite a lot today because I was getting annoyed. Seemed like there weren't that many low scores out there, so kind of knew I was still in it. The pins were probably a little trickier so weren't as many birdies as yesterday, so I just got to keep giving myself chances is all I could do. I was hitting good putts. Slight misreads here and there. I knew if I kept rolling it that some would go in.”

Amy Yang (T3, -7) on what she'll do this weekend to keep up the momentum

“Tomorrow I'll just try to do the same. The weather is going to be very cold so it will be playing very different compared to last two days. It's really just simple: There is nothing but the work I've been doing in this offseason. So, yeah, just stick to process, stick to the plan, yeah.”

A Lim Kim (T5, -6) on how implementing some of the things she's been working on this offseason have gone so far this week

“Yeah, so far so good. Before the tournament I really worry about that because feel like beginner. But during the tournament is better than practice, so I really wonder after that tournament, so, yeah, coming soon really great day.”
