COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- Leaders: **Hannah Green** and **Minjee Lee** currently lead the field at 11-under-par through three rounds
 - Green had her third consecutive under par round
 - Carded five birdies and a bogey
 - Had consecutive birdies on Nos. 11-13
 - Hit 7/14 fairways, 16/18 greens in regulation and had 30 putts
 - Won this event in 2024
 - Has her husband caddying for her this week
 - Lee had a third round 69
 - Carded four birdies and a birdie
 - Hit 11/14 fairways, 16/18 greens in regulation and had 30 putts
 - This is Lee's first start of the 2026 LPGA season

- T3: **Angel Yin** and **Haeran Ryu** are currently tied for third
 - Yin made six birdies and two bogeys en route to her 4-under-par 68
 - Hit 10/14 fairways, 12/18 greens in regulation and had 26 putts
 - Currently tied for second for fewest putts made through three rounds with 79
 - Bounced back from her first round 74 with a second round 64
 - Finished T48 at the Honda LPGA Thailand last week
 - Ryu had her third consecutive under-par round with a third round 70
 - Had six birdies, two bogeys and two double bogeys during her third round
 - Had consecutive birdies on hole Nos. 13-15
 - Hit 10/14 fairways, 15/18 greens in regulation and had 32 putts
 - Currently leads the field in fewest number of bogeys across three rounds with three
 - Ryu has recorded wins in 2023, 2024 and 2025 and was the 2023 Louise Suggs Rolex Rookie of the year
- Defending champion **Lydia Ko** shot an even par second round and sits at T27
 - Carded four birdies and four bogeys
- LPGA rookie **Mimi Rhodes** is currently T12 after a third round 72
 - Current score is a 68-69-73 – 210
 - Appears in the field this week as a sponsor invitation
- Amateur and sponsor invitation **Xingtong Chen** is currently T66 after three rounds
 - If she finishes in the top 40 she will receive a LEAP point
 - One of two Singaporeans in the field (the other is 2025 LET Order of Merit winner **Shannon Tan**)

WITH A WIN

Hannah Green

- Would earn her seventh career victory and first of 2026
- Would be the third two-time winner of the HSBC Women's World Championship, joining **Jin Young Ko** and **Inbee Park**
- Would be her first win since the 2024 BMW Ladies Championship
- Would surpass \$500,000 in season official earnings
- Would surpass \$8 million in career official earnings
- Would be the third unique winner of the 2026 LPGA Tour season
- Would be her first LPGA Tour win with her husband as her caddie

Minjee Lee

- Would earn her twelfth career victory and first of 2026
- Would be the first time she has won in her first start of an LPGA Tour season
- Would surpass \$19 million in career official earnings
- Would be her first win since the 2025 KPMG Women's PGA Championship
- Would be the third Australian to win at this event joining **Hannah Green** and **Karrie Webb**
- Would be one win closer to passing **Jan Stephenson** (16 wins), the second most-winning Australian
- Would remain as fifth on the Official Career Money List

- Is \$1,637,057 away from passing fellow Aussie Karrie Web (3rd)

- Represented Australia at the 2023 and 2025 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown
- Represented Australia at the 2020 and 2024 Olympics
- In 2025, made 14 cuts made in 20 events and surpassed \$1 million in season official earnings

- Has 11 career victories including three majors
- Won the 2025 KPMG Women's PGA Championship
- Awarded the 2022 and 2025 Rolex ANNIKA Major Award
- Represented Australia at the 2016, 2020 and 2024 Olympics
- Represented Australia at the 2014, 2016, 2018, 2023 and 2025 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown
 - Lee is the only amateur to have ever competed in the International Crown
- In 2025, made 21 cuts in 22 events and had \$3.9 million in season official earnings
 - Recorded eight top-10 finishes including her major win

Hannah Green (T1, -11) on her approach heading into the final round

“Yeah, definitely, there are a lot of birdies to be made but it's very easy to make bogey. So I think just limiting as many of those as possible. I've been hitting the ball into the greens, so if I can continue to do that, and even though I'm playing with Minjee, we are good friends, I don't want to get too caught up in what her scores are. I want to do my thing and hopefully keep making birdies and make lots of putts.”

Minjee Lee (T1, -11) on her course management throughout the week

“Yeah, I felt like it was playing a little more trickier today for some reason, maybe the pin placements were a little bit tougher. I know a few of the tees were up but it just felt like they were a little bit harder than the last two days. So I think that's what a great championship should be like, anyways. Just trying to play the best that I can and manage the heat the best that I can.”

Angel Yin (T3, -10) on what she thinks is necessary to win

“Good golf and good luck. Honestly there's nothing much you can do to it. There's a lot of instances today where it was like one hole, I made this unbelievable up-and-down. That's skill and luck to me. So get lucky and get good.”

Haeran Ryu (T3, -10) on if she thinks she's in a good position heading into Sunday

“I think so, too. Because maybe one shot is lead is more pressure and more just -- yeah, I'm behind one shot, and I'm just more in a strong place.”
