COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- 70 players made the cut at +1 or better
 - Notable storylines to watch this weekend:
 - Past champion **Brooke Henderson** is in her best position (T2) heading into the weekend on the LPGA Tour since the 2023 Hilton Grand Vacations Tournament of Champions
 - World No. 1 **Nelly Korda** looks clinch her spot in the LPGA Hall of Fame with a win
 - **Jing Yan** is holding her second consecutive R2 position of T11 or better
 - **Megan Khang** making her first cut in her last four starts; holds one of her best R2 positions of the season (T17)
 - Canadian **Anna Huang** making her first cut at a major championship

- KPMG Ambassador **Leona Maguire** making her first major championship cut of 2026
 - **Isabella Fierro** making her second cut in a major championship and first since the 2024 Chevron Championship
 - Rookie **Carolina Chacarra** making her third cut of the season and second in a major championship
 - Rookies **Briana Chacon** and **Carolina Melgrati** making their first cuts in a major championship, respectively
 - Former champion and European Solheim Cup captain **Anna Nordqvist**, making her first cut at the KPMG Women's PGA Championship since 2023 when she finished T3
 - Former champion **Sung Hyun Park**, making her first cut since the 2024 KPMG Women's PGA Championship
 - **Nicole Felce** made the cut on the number; the only member of the Corebridge Financial Team to make the cut
 - Notable players to miss the cut:
 - Defending champion **Minjee Lee**
 - **Hannah Green**, who won the 2019 KPMG Women's PGA Championship at Hazeltine
 - Past champions **Yani Tseng** and **Danielle Kang**
 - Recent LPGA Tour winners **Gina Kim** and **Yana Wilson**
- The last time there were as many as four players from Korea among the Top 10 and ties through 36 holes of this championship was in 2017
 - That year, there were five such players among the Top 10 after two rounds, including **Sei Young Kim** (T1), **Amy Yang** (T3), **Mi Hyang Lee** (T3), **Chella Choi** (T3), and **So Yeon Ryu** (T8)
- 1st: **Ina Yoon**
 - Her 12-under score is the lowest score to par through 36 holes in KPMG Women's PGA Championship history
 - (-11, 2022) In Gee Chun at Congressional Country Club (Won by 1 stroke)
 - (-11, 2021) Nelly Korda at The Highlands (Won by 3 strokes)
 - (-11, 2001) Karrie Webb at DuPont Country Club (Won by 2 strokes)
 - Her first lead/co-lead after 36 holes on the LPGA Tour
 - The last player to be 12-under-par or lower through the first 36 holes of any major championship was Nelly Korda at this year's Chevron Championship
 - She went on to win the tournament
 - Her 14 birdies lead the field through 36 holes
- T2: **A Lim Kim, Nasa Hataoka, Brooke Henderson, and Haeran Ryu**
 - Kim shot a 2-under 70 in R2
 - Is one of four Koreans in the top 10
 - Has had just two over-par holes through 36 holes
 - Her best position after 36 holes in her career at the KPMG Women's PGA Championship
 - Her previous best was T17 in 2022
 - Hataoka played her last three holes in 3-under to card a 5-under 67
 - Her best second round score of the season
 - Her best placing at the KPMG Women's PGA Championship after 36 holes
 - One of eight Japanese players to make the cut
 - Henderson is one of three players with two rounds in the 60s after her 68 in R2
 - Is top 10 among the field in hit fairways and greens in regulation

- Has recorded just one bogey in each of her first two rounds
 - Ryu shot the low round of the day with an 8-under 64
 - Fourth time in her major championship career that Ryu shot the best score during one round (tied or outright)
 - One of two bogey-free rounds for the day
- **Shannon Tan** made a hole-in-one on No. 4 in the second round with a 6-iron from 169 yards
 - Her first hole-in-one on the LPGA Tour and in a major championship

- **Ryann O'Toole** and **Jasmine Suwannapura** withdrew during the second round, respectively

- Second start at the KPMG Women's PGA Championship
 - 2025 – MC
- 2026: 11 cuts made in 12 starts with four top 10s
 - Recorded back-to-back top four finishes at the JM Eagle LA Championship and The Chevron Championship
 - Her fourth-place finishes are her career best
 - Her previous was T10 in 2025
 - Her four top 10 finishes are a career-best in a single season
 - Had just one in her rookie season
- Career: Five top 10s with \$1.5 million in official career earnings
 - Finished eighth at the Final Qualifying portion of LPGA Q-Series to earn LPGA Tour Membership for the 2025 season
 - Two-time winner on the KLPGA with her last win coming in 2024

QUOTABLE

Ina Yoon (1st, -12) on heading into the weekend with a big lead

"The remaining two days will obviously be nerve-wracking, but being nervous is human nature, and I think I want to embrace that and focus on what I can in my shots."

Haeran Ryu (T2, -7) on how she is able to post low scores consistently

"Every round is so different, but today, yeah, yesterday my score is not good, so I just think about it like it's, okay, I just missed cut. I just trusted my swing and then I work out a lot in Korea, so I just trust my swing and my confidence and my putter and shots. That's it. And then I don't care anything. I just care for my swing."

Dongeun Lee (T6, -6) on being near the top of the leaderboard

"I'm extremely happy being up there and I'm a little nervous but I'm trying to forget about that and then enjoy my game of how to play tomorrow."

Karis Davidson (T8, -5) on being in contention early in a major championship

"Yeah, today felt -- I felt a little bit under pressure today actually. I've never been in contention in a major after the first round, so it was a little bit of a different experience for me. And I hit two bad shots that cost me two double-bogeys today but really grinded in the middle and made a couple about birdies. Still seems like I'm in contention, so I think it was good to get that pressure out of the way today, and then I can hopefully have a couple good rounds on the weekend."

Weiwei Zhang (T8, -5) on her goal for the week

"Yeah, for this week my goal only just smooth swing and confident short putt and clear mind. I don't think much about score, yeah. But I still feel a lot pressure here, uh-huh."

Maja Stark (T11, -4) on the differences between rounds one and two

"Yeah, I felt like yesterday I wasn't playing that bad. Felt like I was just -- I was hitting it a little further than we expected so I passed the hole a few times. I had some good birdie opportunities but they just didn't go in. Felt like I had good game in my body, but I just didn't get anything yesterday; I got everything today."

Nicole Felce (T55, +1) on making the cut as an LPGA and PGA Professional

"Surreal. Still trying to get all the thoughts. But, yeah, it's unbelievable. Truly a blessing. Something I never could have imagined. So to say that I'm playing the weekend in this major championship, it's huge."
