### COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- 1st: **Haeran Ryu**
  - Carded a 4-under 68 to hold a one-shot lead
  - This is the seventh time she has held the lead/co-lead heading into the final round
    - The third time in a major championship (2024 & 2025 The Chevron Championship)
    - Went on to win in two of the other six instances
  - Has made one bogey in her last 36 holes after making three bogeys in round one
  - Leads the field in greens in regulation, with 46/54
  - Was 10 shots back of the lead after round one

- No one in the last 60 years has come from 10+ shots back after round one of a major and gone on to win

- 2nd: **Brooke Henderson**
  - Carded her third straight round in the 60s
    - The only player in the field with all three rounds in the 60s this week
  - Has made one bogey in each of her three rounds
  - Has been in the final group in the final round of an official LPGA stroke play event 20 times in her career, winning 11 of the 20 instances
  - Her first time being in the final group since 2024 at The Chevron Championship

- 3rd: **Ina Yoon**
  - Posted her first over-par round of the tournament in R3
  - Has had over 30 putts in her last two rounds
    - Had 24 in R1
  - Leads the field in birdies with 17
  - Will play in the final group in the final round for the first time at a major championship
- **Angel Yin** withdrew before the start of the third round due to illness

## WITH A WIN

### Haeran Ryu

- Would win her first major championship on the LPGA Tour
  - Would be the first player to win her first major championship since Miyu Yamashita at the 2025 AIG Women's Open
- Would be the 31st player to win the KPMG Women's PGA Championship as their first major championship victory and first since Amy Yang at the 2024 KPMG Women's PGA Championship
- Would be the first major champion from the Republic of Korea since Amy Yang at the 2024 KPMG Women's PGA Championship
- Would become the 21st player from the Republic of Korea to win a major championship
  - The first Korean player to win their first major championship since A Lim Kim at the 2020 U.S. Open presented by Ally
- Would have a win in each of her first four seasons on the LPGA Tour
- Would become the third player from the Republic of Korea to win on Tour this season, joining Mi Hyang Lee (Blue Bay LPGA) and Hyo Joo Kim (Fortinet Founders Cup, Ford Championship)
- Would become the sixth different player from the Republic of Korea to win this event since 2015

### Brooke Henderson

- Would win her third major championship and first since The Amundi Evian Championship in 2022
- Would be her second victory at the KPMG Women's PGA Championship
- It is the 10-year anniversary of her first major championship victory

- It has been 10 years since she claimed her first major championship victory at the 2016 KPMG Women's PGA Championship where she became the youngest winner of the event at 18 years, nine months and two days
- Her sister, Brittany gave birth to her first child this week, named Sahalee after the course where Brooke won her first major championship
- Would tie for the longest span between victories at the KPMG Women's PGA Championship with Betsy Rawls (1959, 1969)
- Would be her 15th LPGA Tour victory and first since last year's CPKC Women's Open
- Would be her first LPGA Tour victory as a Member without her sister, Brittany on her bag
  - Her cousin, Ryan is caddying for her this week
  - Her sister did not caddie for her at the 2015 Cambia Portland Classic
- Would be the second time that Henderson has won after being in the final group of a major championship
  - Also won the 2022 Amundi Evian Championship when she was in the final group

#### Ina Yoon

- Would become a Rolex First-Time Winner and major champion on the LPGA Tour
  - Would be the first player to have her first LPGA Tour win be a major championship since Miyu Yamashita at the 2025 AIG Women's Open
- Would be the 31st player to win the KPMG Women's PGA Championship as their first major championship victory and first since Amy Yang at the 2024 KPMG Women's PGA Championship
- Would be the first major champion from the Republic of Korea since Amy Yang at the 2024 KPMG Women's PGA Championship
- Would become the 21st player from the Republic of Korea to win a major championship
  - The first Korean player to win their first major championship since A Lim Kim at the 2020 U.S. Open presented by Ally
- Would become the third player from the Republic of Korea to win on Tour this season, joining Mi Hyang Lee (Blue Bay LPGA) and Hyo Joo Kim (Fortinet Founders Cup, Ford Championship)
- Would become the sixth different player from the Republic of Korea to win this event since 2015
- Would become the third Rolex first-time winner this season, joining Yana Wilson and Gina Kim

#### Nelly Korda

- Would earn two points toward the LPGA Hall of Fame, meeting the 27-point threshold required for induction
  - Would become the 36th member of the LPGA Hall of Fame
  - Would be the first player to be inducted into the LPGA Hall of Fame since Lydia Ko in 2024
- Would pass Annika Sorenstam on the all-time career money list; a spot Sorenstam has held since May 6, 2001
- Would earn her third consecutive major championship in 2026 and become the third player to win the first three major championships in a season, joining Inbee Park (2013) and Babe Zaharias (1950)
- Would clinch the Rolex ANNIKA Major Award and win the award for the second time in her career
  - Would be the first player to win the award after winning three major championships in a season
- Would earn a fifth major championship victory in her career
  - Would become the 17th player in LPGA Tour history with five or more major championships

- Would claim her second career victory at the KPMG Women’s PGA Championship, also winning in 2021
- Would join Cristie Kerr and Laura Davies with 20 career LPGA Tour wins
  - Would become the 30th player to have 20 or more wins on the LPGA Tour

  - Finished runner-up in her last start at the Kroger Queen City Championship presented by P&G
  - Has not finished outside the top 15 in her last four starts on the LPGA Tour
- Career: Three wins, 30 top 10s and \$6.6 million in official career earnings
  - Earned medalist honors at the Final Qualifying portion of LPGA Q-Series to earn LPGA Tour Membership for the 2023 season
  - Won the 2023 Louise Suggs Rookie of the Year Award
  - Has a win in each of her first three seasons on the LPGA Tour
    - 2023 Walmart NW Arkansas Championship presented by P&G
    - 2024 FM Championship
    - 2025 Black Desert Championship presented by Greater Zion
  - Competed for the Republic of Korea at the 2025 Hanwha LIFEPLUS International Crown

**QUOTABLE**

*Haeran Ryu (1st, -11) on the back nine being more difficult than her front nine*

“Yeah, today my front nine, it was amazing because I got an eagle and three birdies. I started the back nine, it was more windy and a lot of tough shots and tough putts, but I just made one bogey today, so it was, I think, good for me for tomorrow, and tomorrow I just want to have more confidence and more calm.”

*Brooke Henderson (2nd, -10) on if she likes being in the final group in a major championship*

“Definitely. I think everyone in this field, that's where they wanted to be starting Sunday was in that final group. It was a lot of fun for me to play in the final group today. It's been a little while, since I guess Canada, since I was in a final group. It was just a lot of fun and good energy, and I'm excited that I was able to put myself back in that position for tomorrow.”

*Ina Yoon (3rd, -9) on holding the lead heading into the weekend*

“It was my first time and experience having such a lead, so I expected to be nervous. Despite that, I think I was able to keep my calm relatively well, and playing through nerves was the lesson I really learned today.”

*Dewi Weber (T4, -8) on her third round and how she feels heading into tomorrow*

“Pretty good. I played good golf. It wasn't super easy. I think the wind makes it tricky, and especially when it's gusty out, it's hard to trust whatever number you've been calculating, and sometimes you get a gust that you didn't account for, and it's kind of hard to -- maybe not. For me, sometimes it's hard to accept that you hit a good shot and it ended up in a bad spot. But yeah, I shot 4-under. I holed a lot of putts. I hit a lot of good shots. I can't really complain about anything.”

*Alison Lee (T6, -6) on how aggressive she will have to be tomorrow*

“Ooh, I mean, from what I can see, it's going to be very windy tomorrow. I think it'll be pretty tough. Even today, the first few holes played really tough, in my opinion. Every single day, I feel like the wind has kind of been a little bit different, so regardless of what we did in our practice round, it's kind of a little bit new. You're hitting a new club into the hole. It plays a little bit differently. Tomorrow I feel like I'm going to have to -- depending on the wind, just try and play smart. I don't think I can play too aggressively because if the wind gets up there, I think you're going to see a lot more bogeys, especially final round of a major, as well. I'm just going to try and play it smart, play aggressive when I can.”
