**COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS**

- **Leader: Lottie Woad**
  - Earned her second LPGA Tour victory
    - First win since the 2025 ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open
  - Won in her 19th start on the LPGA Tour
    - Is the fastest player to two wins since Sung Hyun Park in 2017 (16 starts)
  - Finished with 21 birdies, the second-most among the field
  - Finished with seven bogeys, tied for the third-fewest among the field
  - Her 268 is her lowest 72-hole score since her win at the 2025 ISPS Handa Women's Scottish
  - Her 199 total matched her career low 54-hole score
    - Set the Kroger Queen City Championship 54-hole scoring record
    - Had 199 total at her win at the ISPS Handa Women's Scottish Open

- **Second: Haeran Ryu**
  - Earned her season-best finish of 2026 and her third top five finish
  - This is her first runner-up finish since the 2024 Dana Open
  - She recorded her sixth top 10 finish of the season, beating her 2025 mark
  - Led the field in birdies with 22
    - Is the most birdies she has made in a tournament this season
    - Her career-best is 24
- **Third: Miyu Yamashita**
  - Recorded the lowest final round score of her career with her 64
  - Her fifth top 10 of the 2026 season and her fourth top five finish
  - Her best finish since the TOTO Japan Classic, also third
  - Made 20 birdies, tied for the third-most among the field
- **Fourth: Ruoning Yin**
  - Earned her third-straight top five finish of the season
    - Recorded back-to-back runner-up finishes in her last two starts
    - Third time in her career she has had three-straight top five finishes
  - Has finished inside the top seven in four of her last five starts
    - Missed the cut at the JM Eagle LA Championship presented by Plastpro
  - Needed only 114 putts, tied for the third-fewest among the field
- **Danielle Kang** withdrew during her first round
- **Haeji Kang** withdrew prior to her second round due to injury
- **Peiyun Chen** withdrew prior to her second round

#### ABOUT THE WINNER

##### Rolex Rankings No. 10 Lottie Woad

- Second start at the Kroger Queen City Championship presented by P&G
  - 2026 – WIN, 2025 – 3
- 2026: Nine cuts made in 10 starts with one win and three additional top 10s
  - Is the first European to win on Tour this season
  - First European to win since **Linn Grant** at The ANNIKA in 2025
  - Is the first Englishwoman to win since **Charley Hull** won this event last season
  - Is the seventh Englishwoman to win at least twice on the LPGA Tour
  - Is the Tour's seventh unique winner of 2026

- Had a season-best finish of T7 done twice at The Chevron Championship and the Hilton Grand Vacations before her win
- Missed the cut in her last start at the Mizuho Americas Open
- Career: Two wins with seven top 10s and \$1.6 million in official career earnings
  - Won in her first start on the LPGA Tour as a full-time Member at the 2025 ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open
  - Became the first athlete to earn LPGA Tour status via the LPGA Elite Amateur Pathway in July 2025 when she tied for third at The Amundi Evian Championship
    - Her T3 finish at The Amundi Evian Championship is the best finish by an amateur at the major championship since Lydia Ko finished second in 2013
  - Won the 2025 KPMG Women's Irish Open as an amateur on the Ladies European Tour
  - Played collegiately at Florida State University
    - Was named the 2023 ACC Freshman of the Year, was named a WCGA All-American three times (2023-25) and was the 2024 ACC Golfer of the Year

### QUOTABLE

*Lottie Woad (1, -12) on what the difference is between winning for her first time and the second time*

"I think the first one just happened so quickly that it was kind of hard to take in. Obviously playing the Open the next week as well, so just kind of moved on quickly. I think now being out here full time and this being my job and that was my first event I think, just seeing the competition each week and traveling and all that, I think this is just definitely a lot sweeter."

*Haeran Ryu (2, -10) on what the key to making so many birdies was this week*

"Yeah, this course green is little bumpy and little slow than another tournament, so I just want to do more hit next to pin and make some easy birdie chance. So that's why I'm making a lot of birdie on the front nine. But back nine is a little bit more windy and a little bit more tricky holes there. Yeah, but I'm second. First runner-up, right? So I'm so happy right now."

*Miyu Yamashita (3, -9) on what she will take away from this round*

"(Through translation.) So the greens were soft but the fairways were firm. It was hard to judge how much the ball would roll out. Even though I thought my tee shots were really solid today. So really good to see my finish position become more consistent and I want to keep doing the same moving forward."

*Ruoning Yin (4, -8) on what part of her game is working best for her in this stretch*

“Actually my swing. My swing doesn't feel good this week. Just miss a lot of -- you can tell from my stats I miss a lot of fairways and greens. But overall I really proud of my putting right now. It just another week doesn't have three putts. Little wins for me. Overall I'm happy.”
