Today – Throughout today, increasing cloud cover will filter into the area as a disturbance approaches the region. Scattered, light rain showers may drift overhead – primarily between 12-3pm – before drier conditions return thereafter. This activity will likely remain as rain though a low lightning potential cannot be ruled out. In addition, temperatures will trend cool once again this morning before warming to near 70F by the late afternoon; southwesterly winds will occur generally calmer at 5-11 mph with the occasional gust near 15 mph possible.

Extended forecast – By Saturday, as a boundary moves near the region, scattered rain showers and isolated thunderstorms will progress into the area. The main wave of activity is currently favoring between 9am-3pm though slight chances are possible outside of this window. An isolated stronger storm is possible at times within this activity which will bring the potential for gustier winds and moderate to heavy rainfall. Heading into Sunday, chances for an isolated shower or storm will linger into the early morning before generally drier conditions return to the area. Thereafter, slight chances of redevelopment are possible in the afternoon hours both Sunday and Monday. Outside of precipitation, southwesterly flow will settle near 6-13 mph with occasional gusts within 20-25 mph. A general warming trend will continue for the remainder of the weekend.
