### COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- Leader: **Nelly Korda** set a new 72-hole tournament scoring record at the Riviera Maya Open at Mayakoba at 271
  - Hit 7/14 fairways, 12/18 greens in regulation, and had 26 putts
  - Converted a 54-hole lead or co-lead into a win for the third time this season
    - Including last week at The Chevron Championship
  - Was a combined 13-under on par 5s through four rounds
  - Recorded two bogeys through 72 holes, the fewest in the field
    - Was bogey-free for 60 holes before a bogey on her 72nd hole of the tournament
  - Was the only player in the field to record four rounds in the 60s
  - Made the most eagles (3) and pars (54) amongst the field over four rounds

- 2nd: **Aprichaya Yubol** carded a 2-under 70 for her best career finish on the LPGA Tour
  - Hit 8/14 fairways, 15/18 greens in regulation, and had 29 putts

- Her previous best finish on the LPGA Tour was T4 at the 2024 Walmart NW Arkansas Championship presented by P&G
- The 70 ties her best final round score of the season
- **Yu Liu** and **Brianna Do** earn a spot in next week's field at the Mizuho Americas Open with third and fourth-place finishes
  - Liu carded a final round 69 to finish in third
    - Made back-to-back birdies on 17 and 18 to secure third
    - This is her best result this season and her best finish since the 2024 Buick LPGA Shanghai, where she finished T3

  - Do finished the week with a 1-under 71
    - Her fourth-place result is the best finish in her LPGA Tour career
      - Her previous best result was at this tournament last year, where she finished T9
    - This was her first made cut on the LPGA Tour this season

- Amateur **Maria Jose Marin** finished with a birdie on No. 18 to move inside the top 5
  - Earns two points in the LPGA Elite Amateur Pathway; she now has 13 points in the standings
  - Recorded her best finish on the LPGA Tour
  - This is the best finish by an amateur at an LPGA Tour event since **Lottie Woad** (T3) at the Amundi Evian Championship
- **Gaby Lopez** was the leading Mexican player, finishing at 3-under for the tournament
  - Shot a 1-over 73 in R4

#### ABOUT THE WINNER

##### [Rolex Rankings No. 1 Nelly Korda](#)

- Earns her 18th LPGA Tour win
  - Is the 26th American to earn 18 or more wins on the LPGA Tour
  - Is the first to reach 18 LPGA Tour wins since **Lydia Ko** at the 2022 BMW Ladies Championship
  - Is the first American to reach 18 LPGA Tour wins since **Cristie Kerr** at the 2015 CME Group Tour Championship
  - Is the youngest American player to reach 18 LPGA Tour wins since **Nancy Lopez** at the 1980 Women's Kemper Open
- Earns her 23rd point toward the LPGA Hall of Fame
  - Twenty-seven points are required for induction into the LPGA Hall of Fame

- Claims her third win of the 2026 season
  - Has more wins this season than players who have finished ahead of her this year in events (**Hyo Joo Kim** (2) and **Lauren Coughlin**)
- Earned back-to-back victories
  - Is the 15th time since 1950 that an LPGA Tour player won a major championship then the tournament after
  - Is the first time since **Celine Boutier** in 2023 (The Amundi Evian Championship, FREED GROUP Women's Scottish open presented by Trust Golf) that a player won a major championship then the tournament after
  - The first time since **Lorena Ochoa** in 2008 (The Chevron Championship, Corona Championship, Ginn Open) that a player won The Chevron Championship and the tournament following it
  - Is the first American player to win the week after winning a major championship since **Meg Mallon** in 2004
  - Is the second player this season to win back-to-back victories alongside **Hyo Joo Kim** (Fortinet Founders Cup, Ford Championship presented by Wild Horse Pass)
- Her third season on the LPGA Tour with three or more victories (2021, four wins; 2024, seven wins)
- Her first win since she returned to No. 1 in the Rolex Women's World Golf Rankings
  - It is her third win the week she returned to Rolex Rankings No. 1 including 2024 Ford Championship presented by Wild Horse Pass and 2021 The ANNIKA driven by Gainbridge at Pelican
- First American to win in Mexico since **Christina Kim** won at the 2014 Citibanmex Lorena Ochoa Invitational presented by Aeromexico and Delta
- Career: 18 wins, three major championship victories, 81 top 10s, \$18.9 million in official career earnings
  - 2024 Rolex Player of the Year and Rolex ANNIKA Major Award winner
  - Two-time Olympian for the United States, 2020 Gold Medal winner in Tokyo
  - Four-time U.S. Solheim Cup Team member

*Nelly Korda (1, -17) on coming back to Mexico next year to compete*

"Definitely. I mean, I've been here on vacation once and now I've come here to compete. I think it was a perfect week after a major championship, too, where it felt like it was super relaxing but I knew that I needed to grind and I was here to work. So it's like a slice of paradise. The resorts are all unbelievable. The food is unbelievable. I must say I'm tacoed out. I'm not going to touch a taco for on the least two weeks now. I've had too many. Everyone has been so nice. I've had such an amazing time. Yeah, I mean, emphasizing it with a win, at the end of the day that's what I was coming here for. There is an aspect to also being super relaxing and a fun vibe this week."

*Aprichaya Yubol (2, -13) on her runner-up finish*

“Yes. How do you say, so finish two is kind of a win for me, too. It's feel like that, because I can make birdie on the last hole for like finish two.”

*Yu Liu (3, -12) on her game and securing a spot in Mizuho next week*

“Yeah, it means so much because this is a course that I felt like it requires you to be -- it really challenges all parts of your game. I felt like thankfully I was able to bring my pretty top game out there, and I also learned a lot throughout my four rounds.”

*Brianna Do (4, -10) on her best golf still being ahead of her*

“It's been good. I mean, I think this week last year and this week this year has taught me a lot. After last year, you know, going into it I believed that my best golf was still ahead of me even though I'm one of the older players out here, and I still believe that. It just showed this week. It's hard to not get emotional, but I'm really proud of myself and how I played, so, yeah.”

“The experience overall here in Mexico was amazing. I think coming into the week I was pretty grateful that I got to compete in my second home. I was born here in Mexico, so it's always good to be back. Overall my game was in pretty good shape and ended up being the result that I wanted, and I think even a little better. Yeah, just really grateful with all the organization and every person that made this week possible. It's been amazing.”
