COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- Leader: **Jenny Shin** shot 71 on Saturday
 - Leads the field in most birdies made (15) and least bogeys made (3) through 54 holes
 - First time in her career that she has led or co-led for the first three rounds of an event
 - She never held the lead or co-lead en route to her 2016 victory
 - Third time she held the lead or co-lead entering the final round
 - 2016 ISPS HANDA Women's Australian Open (finished T9)
 - 2012 HSBC Women's World Championship (finished T2)
 - Is -12 through 54 holes; first time -12 or better since the 2025 Buick LPGA Shanghai
 - Today was her sixth consecutive round under par at the ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open; the longest active streak at the event
 - Has a five-shot lead entering the final round
 - Over the last 15 seasons, players who lead by five or more shots through 54 holes are 20-for-22 converting into wins on the LPGA Tour
 - At this event, the largest round 3 deficit that was overcome was by Mi Hyang Lee in 2017 when she was six strokes back

- The largest margin of victory at this event is four shots, by Lauren Coughlin in 2024 and Mi Jung Hur in 2019
- The last player to have a lead of five strokes or more entering the final round and not win was Grace Kim at the 2024 Meijer LPGA Classic for Simply Give

- 2nd: **Pajaree Anannarukarn** is five shots behind Shin after shooting 69 in round 3
 - Tied for the lowest round across the field on Saturday
 - Recorded the only bogey-free round today
 - Leads the field in greens in regulation through 54 holes (45/54)
 - Has never come from behind to win
 - In her 2021 ISPS HANDA World Invitational win, she was tied for the lead entering the final round
 - Her 2023 win was a match play event, the T-Mobile Match Play presented by MGM Rewards

WITH A WIN

Jenny Shin

- Would be her second LPGA Tour win, joining her win at the 2016 Volunteers of America Texas Shootout presented by JTBC
- Would be her first win in 10 years, 2 months and 25 days
 - The last LPGA player to go 10 or more years between official victories was Vicki Fergon, who went 12 years, 3 months and 6 days between victories at the 1984 S&H Golf Classic and the 1996 Michelob Light Heartland Classic
 - Would be the third time since 1980 that an LPGA player went 10 or more years between official wins
 - The last PGA Tour player to go 10 or more years between victories was Lucas Glover who went 10 years, 2 months and 4 days between the 2011 Wells Fargo Championship and the 2021 John Deere Classic
- Would be the third oldest winner of the event at 33 years
 - 2021 winner, Ryann O'Toole was 34 years old and 2020 winner, Stacy Lewis was 35 years old at the time of their victories
- Would be the third winner of this event from the Republic of Korea joining Mi Jung Hur (2019) and Mi Hyang Lee (2017) since it was co-sanctioned
- Would be the fourth player from the Republic of Korea to win on the LPGA Tour this season, joining Mi Hyang Lee, Hyo Joo Kim and Haeran Ryu
- Would be the 12th different player to win on the LPGA Tour this season through 19 events
- Would be the first wire-to-wire winner since Nelly Korda at The Chevron Championship
- Would be first player to win on the LPGA Tour aged 33 years, 9 months, 18 days or older since Carlota Ciganda won the 2025 Meijer LPGA Classic for Simply Give at 35 years

Pajaree Anannarukarn

- Would be her third LPGA Tour win and first since the 2023 T-Mobile Match Play presented by MGM Rewards

- Would be the second player from Thailand to win on the LPGA Tour this season joining Jeeno Thitikul
- Would be the first player from Thailand to win the ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open since it became a co-sanctioned event with the LET
- Would be the 12th different player to win on the LPGA Tour this season through 19 events

- Eighth start at ISPS HANDA Women's Scottish Open
 - Best finish was T16 in 2023
- 2026: Eight cuts made in 13 starts with one top-10 finish
 - Finished T7 at the Mizuho Americas Open
 - Missed the cut in three of her last four events
- Career: One win, 47 top 10s, \$8 million in official career earnings
 - Won the 2016 Volunteers of America Texas Shootout presented by JTBC
 - Finished fourth on the 2010 Epson Tour money list to earn LPGA Tour Membership

Jenny Shin (1st, -12) on what she is hopes to get from tomorrow

"Hope I don't go blind. There was a few times today where I was looking down at the ball but I couldn't see the ball. So hopefully I can just focus on the things that I focused on, every single shot this week, not get ahead of

myself. It's really hard, though. I can't stop thinking about it. Every shot, I'm like, oh, my God. So I'm going to try my best to stay present, yeah."

Pajaree Anannarukarn (2nd, -7) on the crowds in Scotland

"I love coming here to be honest. I feel like the fans really love the game. Even last year at the British on Sunday at Porthcawl, it was brutal but they showed up clapping and supporting us. It's amazing to see, and I felt the energy, like the love for the game, and that's just really a lot of passion. So I really love to see it and love coming back here."

Esther Henseleit (T3, -5) on how she controls herself

"It's really hard to press on this golf course, to be honest, just no matter like if you want to take birdie or par, you kind of have to hit the same shots because they are the only possible shots. So I don't think my game plan really changed, and yeah, I'm just trying to do my thing out there and hopefully tomorrow I can hit a few close and make some putts."
