**Competition Format:** 156 players; 72-hole stroke play, cut to 60 and ties after 36 holes

**Purse:** \$12 million; \$2.4 million winner's prize

**Whiteline Par and Yardage:** 35-36 – 71; 6,699 yards

**Course Information:**

The Riviera Country Club, located 20 miles west of downtown Los Angeles in Pacific Palisades, was designed by famed Golden-Age architect George C. Thomas Jr., with the assistance of William P. Bell. The club was founded in 1926 by members of the Los Angeles Athletic Club. Thomas took on the design of the project free of charge, and the course opened in 1927. Today, it is considered one of the finest natural layouts in all of golf. Bill Coore and Ben Crenshaw did a restoration of greens and bunkers in 1993. Tom Fazio did redesign work in the 2000s, including the lengthening of several holes.

**Tournament History:**

Edition: 81st

- The 81st U.S. Women's Open is the fourth USGA championship conducted at Riviera.
- This will be the first U.S. Women's Open at Riviera Country Club and second in Southern California, joining the 19th U.S. Women's Open at San Diego Country Club won by Mickey Wright in 1964.
- The 81st U.S. Women's Open will be the last major championship at Riviera before the 2028 Olympic golf competition.
- Riviera is the only site on the 2026 USGA championship calendar that has an annual PGA Tour event, the Genesis Invitational. The club is the second PGA Tour stop to host the U.S. Women's Open in the last four years, joining Pebble Beach in 2023, which annually hosts the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am.
- Riviera becomes the 17th site to host both the U.S. Open and U.S. Women's Open. • Riviera will also host the 2031 U.S. Open
