

2026 SOLHEIM CUP // Day 2 Recap & Day 3 Look-Ahead

- This is the seventh time that the Solheim Cup has been tied entering the final round. Over the six previous occasions, the home team has a record of 5-0-1.
- Saturday was just the fourth day in Solheim Cup history in which one team earned three or more points in the morning session and the other team earned three or more points in the afternoon session. That also happened in 2002 (Day 1 & 2) and in 2023 (Day 1).
- Captain Stanford put out five players on Saturday afternoon who had zero points up to that point in the competition: Andrea Lee (0-2-0), Rose Zhang (0-2-0), Auston Kim (0-2-0), Lindy Duncan (0-1-) and Jennifer Kupcho (0-2-0). All five players won their respective afternoon matches.
- Prior to Saturday afternoon's heroics, Jennifer Kupcho had just one win over her last 10 Solheim Cup matches (1-7-2). Only a few other American players have ever endured a 10-match span throughout which they won one or fewer matches. Angela Stanford is one of them (between 2009 and 2015).
- Historically, the U.S. Team has dominated **singles** play in the Solheim Cup, leading 122.5 to 97.5 under that format. However, the singles session has been incredibly close in each of the last five editions:

- A few significant streaks ended today:
 - Nelly Korda & Allisen Corpuz lost in foursomes on Saturday morning, tarnishing their previously perfect 5-0-0 record.
 - Megan Khang's six-game winning streak and nine-game unbeaten streak ended on Saturday afternoon.
 - Lauren Coughlin lost the first match of her Solheim Cup career on Saturday afternoon, dropping her record to 5-1-2.
- Yealimi Noh has been a force in **four-balls** this week. She leads all players in this competition with 14 four-ball par-breakers, including five birdies and an eagle on Friday and seven more birdies on Saturday. At one point she made nine birdies (or eagle) over a 13-hole span, dating back to Friday afternoon. As a point of comparison, there was no better birdie spree of its kind by any player during the 2026 LPGA Tour season.
- Alison Lee will bring a perfect 3-0-0 record into tomorrow's singles matches. With a win on Sunday, Lee would join a select list of American players to earn four points at one Solheim Cup: Dottie Pepper (1998, 4-0-0), Morgan Pressel (2011, 4-0-0), and Rose Zhang (2024, 4-0-0).
- The Solheim Cup rookie tandem of Nastasia Nadaud & Mimi Rhodes won their foursomes match on Saturday morning after winning their four-ball match on Friday. They become the first rookie duo ever to win twice.
- Charley Hull & Lottie Woad lost two more times on Saturday after going 0-1-1 on Friday. They are the first duo to ever play four times together at one Solheim Cup.

Individually, they become the only players in history to play in all four sessions prior to the final day and earn less than one total point (both players have a record of 0-3-1, for .5 points). Including Hull and Woad, there have been 43 instances of a player participating in all four sessions prior to the final session.
