COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

- Winner: **Jennifer Kupcho** won her fourth career victory and first of 2025
 - Became the 16th different player from the United States to win the ShopRite LPGA Classic and first since **Lexi Thompson** in 2019
 - Birdied No. 18 to win her fourth career victory
 - She is the second player to birdie the last hole to win by one stroke this season joining **Angel Yin** at the Honda LPGA Thailand
 - Was one of 11 players to record all three rounds in the 60s
 - The first player to do so since **Rio Takeda** won the 2024 TOTO Japan Classic
 - Had 19 birdies, the third-most among the field

- Had just four bogeys, tied for the fifth fewest among the field
 - Her four bogeys are the fewest she has ever recorded at this event
- 2nd: **Ilhee Lee** recorded her best finish on Tour since the 2014 TOTO Japan Classic, also runner-up
 - First top-10 finish since the 2016 Reignwood LPGA Classic
 - First top-5 finish since the 2016 Pure Silk-Bahamas LPGA Classic
 - First top-3 finish since 2015 Founders Cup
 - Finished first among the field in birdies made (20) and fewest putts (77)
 - Her first round 63 is her career-best 18-hole score and lowest since the 2015 Kia Classic
 - Only the second time in her career she finished a tournament with all rounds in the 60s
 - First since the 2013 Kingsmill Championship (72-hole event)
 - Best finish at the ShopRite LPGA Classic in 11 starts
 - Will not be competing at the Meijer LPGA Classic for Simply Give next week
- 3rd: **Sei Young Kim** tied her lowest 18-hole score of the season in her final round, 65
 - Recorded her second top-10 finish of the 2025 season
 - Best finish since the 2024 Buick LPGA Shanghai, T2
 - Her best finish at the ShopRite LPGA Classic in eight starts
 - Was previously fourth in 2018
 - Made her first cut in her last three starts on Tour this season
 - Recorded the third ace of her career on No. 17
 - She hit her 56-degree wedge 76 yards
 - Led the field in fewest bogeys with just two over three rounds
- 4th: **Ayaka Furue** recorded her second-straight top five finish at this event
 - Recorded 12 birdies and had just three bogeys the entire week, tied for the second fewest among the field
 - Her third top-5 finish of the 2025 season
 - Finished T2 at the HSBC Women's World Championship and 3rd at the Blue Bay LPGA
 - Tied her lowest 18-hole score of 66 in her first two rounds before her third round 70
- World No. 1 **Nelly Korda** finished T15
 - Korda has not missed a cut this season and has not finished worse than T28 at an event

- Fourth start at the ShopRite LPGA Classic presented by Acer, first since 2021
 - 2024 – Win, 2021 – MC, 2020 – 2, 2019 – T43

- 2025: Eight cuts made in 11 starts, one win
 - Becomes the 134th player to win in the history of the LPGA at least four times
 - Becomes the 80th American to win at least four times on the LPGA Tour
 - Claimed her first top-10 of the 2025 season
 - Best non-win finish of T11 at the Honda LPGA Thailand earlier this season
 - First top-10 finish since the 2025 Walmart NW Arkansas Championship presented by P&G
- Career: Four wins, 23 top 10s, \$5.7 in official Career Earnings
 - First win on Tour since the 2022 Dow Championship
 - She won three times in 2022 including The Chevron Championship
 - Represented the United States at three-straight Solheim Cups (2021, 2023, 2024)
 - Finished second at the inaugural LPGA Q-Series to earn LPGA Tour status for the 2019 season; competed as an amateur and turned professional in May of 2019
- Won the inaugural 2019 Augusta National Women's Amateur
- Played collegiately at Wake Forest University

QUOTABLES

Jennifer Kupcho (1, -15) on what this win means to her

"Yeah, I mean, it's been a long time. I felt like last year -- even though the year before I had won three times, I felt like last year was one of my best seasons, maybe my best season with how consistent I played; obviously just didn't get a win. But then, yeah, coming into this year off last year I just expected my game to stay the same. Struggled a lot at the beginning of the year. Struggled mentally. Completely lost my swing back in LA pretty much, so really just like trying to figure that out. Going into Chevron I didn't know where the ball was going. So to be able to say I've won now, like only really a few weeks later, is kind of insane."

Ilhee Lee (2nd, -14) on how much she enjoyed today

"It was so fun to watch Jennifer playing, and I was always watching her on TV. I was right next to her and actually I was cheering for her because it's just golf. I mean, it's not need to make it happen. We all try our best. So I was actually cheering for her. Said good shots and nice putts and stuff. And we were talking a little bit on 18th hole about pace of play because it was my first time playing this quick on Sunday. Yeah, we were talking about pace of play a little bit. Yeah, it was awesome to watch her play."

Sei Young Kim (3rd, -13) on her third career ace on No. 17

"Yeah, I mean, especially today the tees move up so I'm using meters, so 77 meter to the pin which is 85 yard. So I took a 56, my wedge, and I try to hit -- it's a little bit downwind so I try to pitch it to the front edge. I hit the right number and I saw the bounce, one, and in. I was like, wow. My skin everywhere was goosebump."





Aline Krauter (T5, -10) on her week

"It's been a great week. I've played really solid golf and I've played really solid golf over the last couple weeks. Just nice to see everything come together. My weekend golf has been pretty shaky, so to be under par again today is nice. Nice to see the golf game is trending in the right direction."
